Cash advance

Farmers growing soybeans and holding them in storage for resale later are eligible to apply for a cash advance. This amounts to \$150.00/tonne and is available from the Ontario Soya-Bean Growers' Marketing Board. The main advantage to the farmer is that it gives him the use of this money interest free from the time the payment is received until the beans are

marketed.

One stipulation is that the beans must be marketed before July 31, 1982.

This program applies to home farm storage as well as other types of storage.

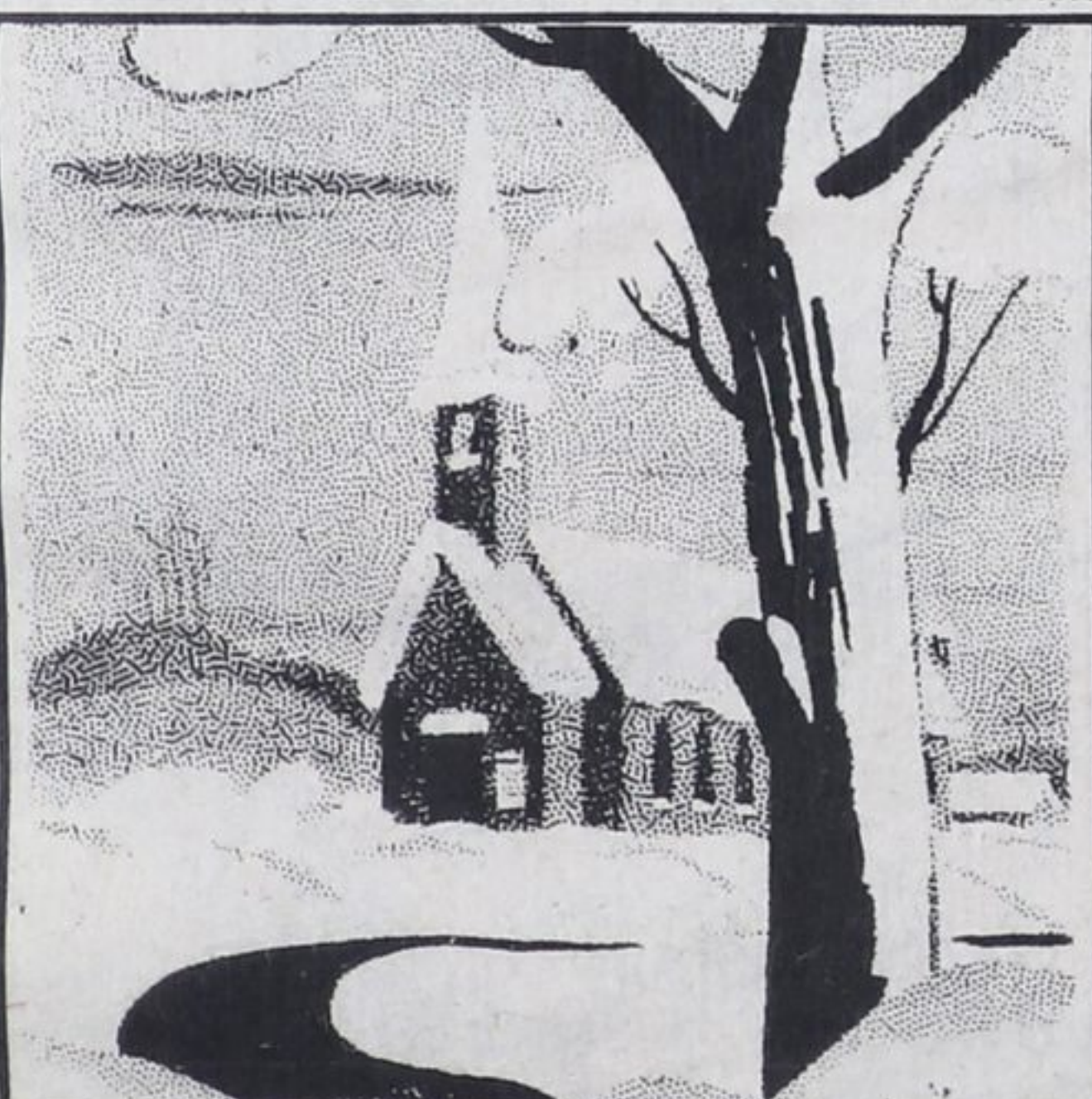
