

Four for four

Kings hit Centennials for another big loss

A confident Penetanguishene Kings squad skated over local rival Midland Centennials for a 12-5 win in Georgian Bay Junior C Hockey League action Sunday afternoon at Penetanguishene Arena.

Though weekend results from other league games have yet to be officially tallied, the Kings appear to have secured sole possession of second place in the eight-team league after the win. The Bracebridge Bears continue to lead, two points ahead of the Penetanguishene squad. And while the Kings move up, the Centennials are rocketing downward. With Sunday's loss, the Midlanders appear to have dipped to sixth spot -- the loop's last playoff position.

The Kings, who've beaten the Centennials in all four of their meetings this season, blasted off to a quick start and never looked back.

They had three goals past Cents starter Dwayne Latondress before the visitors responded with a goal at the five-minute mark. The Penetanguishene squad then opened the

gash with three goals in 28 seconds during the 11-minute span -- the first two on Latondress and the last on Brad Bumstead.

From there, the Kings coasted, scoring four more times in the second and twice in the third period. Four of their goals came on the power play.

The Centennials came up with one power play goal, their final marker, which came in the final minute of play.

Latondress and Bumstead faced a total of 57 shots between them; Kings goaltender Kevin Steel faced 29 at the other end.

League-leading scorer Carl Cowan scored two goals and four assists to lead the Kings to their 13th win in 24 season outings. Doug Gillespie notched three goals.

Noel McEachern scored three times for the Centennials, and singles were added by Dwayne Story, Frank Dance and Paul Hahn.

More than 500 people attended the matchup.

Referee Ken Banerman handed the Kings ten minors and doled out 17 minors and one misconduct -- to Brian Cadeau -- to the Centennials.

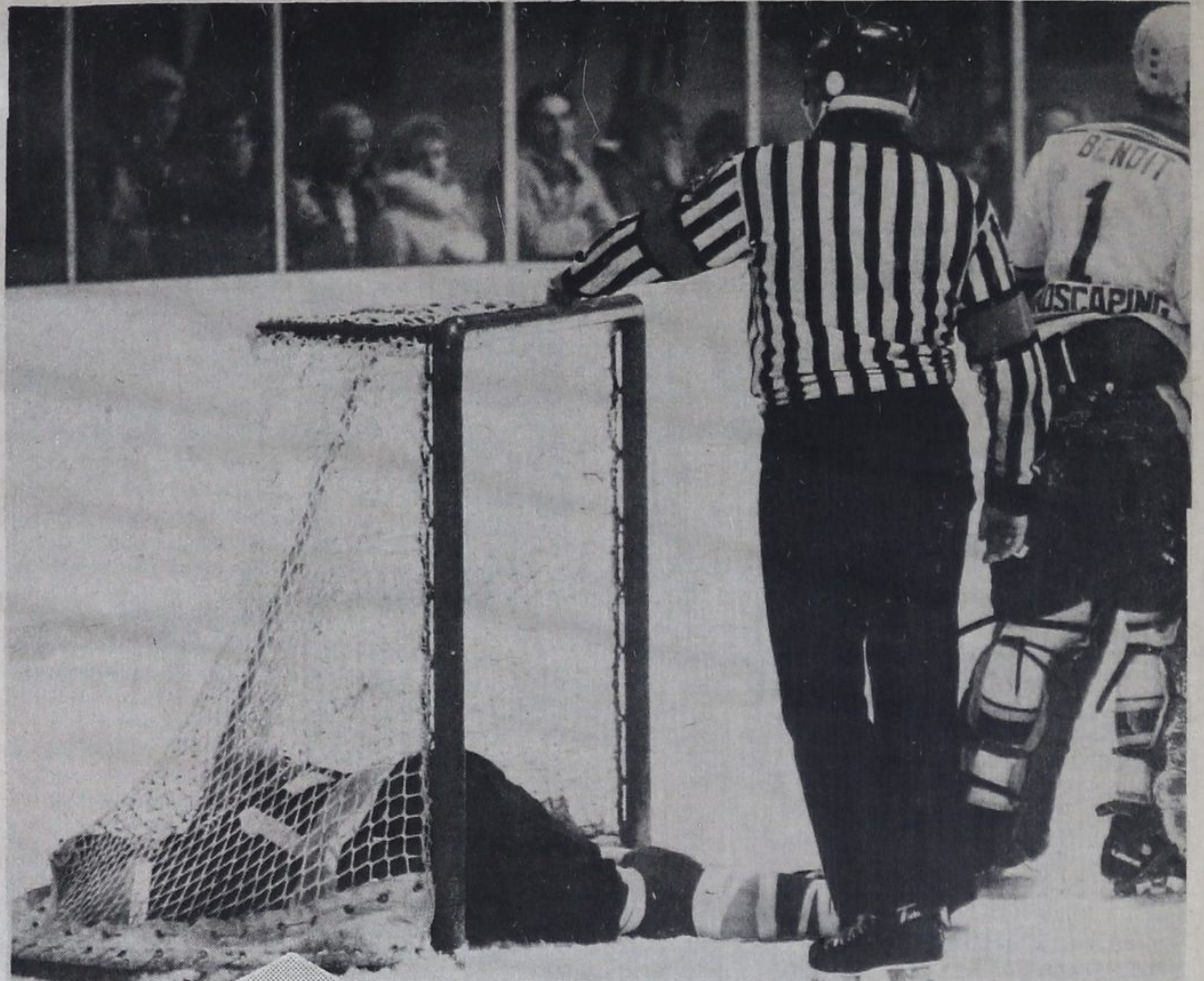
Penetanguishene

"I don't know what happened Sunday, we got the jitters or something. That happened all last year, too, but we still beat them (the Kings) in the playoffs," Garner said. "The rest of our schedule isn't that tough, though. We can beat anybody, and we shouldn't have any trouble keeping up. We've just got to put a
