## Georgian to host CCAA badminton

Georgian College will host the 1982 Canadian Colleges Athletic Association (CCAA) National Badminton Championships, March 25-28, in facilities at Base Borden.

A total of 64 athletes, representing top Canadian

College badminton players, have survived competitions among the eight athletic conferences of the 155 Colleges across Canada.

Other national College competitions are being played in Lethbridge, Alberta. Because of a shortage of available facilities in Alberta, the CCAA moved the badminton event to Ontario.

He is being assisted by Bill Harrison, Supervisor of Athletics and Student Affairs, Michelle Ethier of the same department, and Karen Regier, supervisor of athletics and student activities at the Orillia Campus.
