# Important meeting tomorrow

complications of diabetes

Dr. John K. Warnica from Barrie will be guest speaker at the January meeting of the Canadian Diabetes Association tomorrow, at the Knights of Columbus Hall, Penetanguishene.

Dr. Warnica's discussion will give information concerning one of the complications of diabetes impaired vision.

Because uncontrolled diabetes with its high level of blood sugar causes circulatory problems, the tiny blood vessels of the eyes are almost always affected.

Often people who call themselves "borderline" diabetics do not take this complication seriously enough. Controlling the slightly elevated blood sugar could save the grief that later poor eyesight brings.

This should therefore be a meeting that these "borderline" diabetics or persons where there is a family history of diabetes, should attend.
