

Ontario winter experience for Australians

Blowing snow and wind chill are not problems that Elmvale District High School teachers Alan Margison and Richard Austin have to endure this latter half of the winter of 1981-82. The two Elmvale high school teachers flew with their families to Australia to take up teaching there

for the rest of the year. In their place at EDHS are two Australian teachers.

Don McInnes, from southern Australia, brought his wife and two children to Elmvale. The two children attend Huronia Centennial Elementary School.

McInnes' school in Australia, unlike EDHS,

does not have a semester system. The students there work on eight subjects for a full year.

His school has a student population of 240, twice that of EDHS. The students must wear uniforms to school every day. The girls may wear green slacks and blouse, or a green skirt and sweater.

The boys wear grey dress pants, shirt, and a tie.

For Fun Days, the student council arranges a casual day when the students can wear regular clothing of their own choice.

During these days, the student council fines students who are not wearing their school uniform. The fines are a means of raising money to pay for school events.

Sports are very popular at McInnes'

school. The boys like to play football and the girls like to play netball.

Netball is similar to basketball, but there is no dribbling.

In the summer, the boys play cricket and the girls play tennis.

Coming to Elmvale has been an experience for McInnes. In Australia now it is summer. Summer temperatures range from 35C to 40C. Winter is also different here than in Australia.

McInnes has found Australia's winter passes without snow. Winter temperature there ranges from 7C to 8C with occasional frost.

Graeme Jones, the other visiting Australian, hails from Melbourne, the capital of the state of Victoria.

Jones' school also does not have a semester system. The school he

came from has 850 students and 100 teachers on staff.

On Fun Days at Jones' school, the students council would arrange a formal dress day during which the boys wear suits and the girls wear long gowns.

Winters in Melbourne are very damp, and cold, Jones says. The

temperature averages about 2C. It rises to as high as 40C in the summer. It is too hot at times to go to school, but everyone must attend, Jones says.

The Melbourne teacher has found the

local weather very refreshing, a dramatic change from Australian weather.

Both McInnes and Jones live in Elmvale and will be at EDHS for a year.
