

Roadrunners are consoled

The Roadrunners won the Midland Recreational Hockey League consolation championship with a 7-4 victory over Performance Motor Sports Monday at Midland Arena.

The Roadrunners won the best-of-seven consolation series in four straight games.

In championship-round semi-final matchups, Olympia Sports and Duggan Polar Kings stand only one point away from a final-series clash after they

both won their Monday matchups to take 5-3 leads in their six-point series.

The Roadrunners had control of the game from the beginning on Monday, taking a 3-2 lead after the first period and boosting it to 5-2 by the end of the second.
