
Control by Indians the goal, chief says

Huronia's Indians want to have more control over their lives and the purchase of a building on Midland's main street to act as a central office for five of the area's Indian bands is one means of achieving some control, Chief Rodney Monague told Midland Rotarians this week.

Chief Monague, from Christian Island, mentioned the possible development of cooperative commercial fishing around the island, and the development of nearby Beckwith Island, as two examples of Indian enterprise.

A \$12,000 provincial grant was used to study the possibilities of fishing around Christian Island. There is a twomile protected area

around the island, the chief said. A twelve person group

fisherman might be set up to fish the waters and sell the catch, perhaps

in New York State. The owner of the Delawanna Inn, and a

German group, both have ideas for the building of a tourist resort on Beckwith Island, Chief Monague said.

The chief speculated that the Indian Act will pass into history, "perhaps by the next generation." Eventually Indian bands will become equivalent to municipalities, he suggested.

Other sources of income for Christian Island are charcoal and lumber. \$90,000 of lumber, and 50 tons of charcoal, were sold last year. The island's population is growing however, thus the interest by the band in developing other islands, like Beckwith Island.






