Simcoe North MP Douglas Lewis of Orillia is one of 73 Ontario Chartered Accountants to receive the highest honour the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Ontario can bestow on its members.

For their outstanding service to the profession and for the distinction they have brought to it, the 73 Ontario Chartered Accountants from all walks of life and from all parts of the province have been elected by the Council of The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Ontario (ICAO) as Fellows of the Institute (FCA's.)

The new Fellows bring the number of FCA's in the province to 517. Ontario FCA elections are held every three years. Any of the ICAO's more than 16,000 members can nominate fellow Chartered Accountants they believe meet the demanding FCA criteria.

The criteria require excellence of achievement in a nominee's participation in community, business, professional and charitable organizations; in pursuit of career; in research, teaching, writing or speaking on professional matters; or in the work of the ICAO.

The ICAO is one of the oldest and largest of Ontario's professional bodies.

Founded in 1879, the institute, under the Public Accountancy Act, is the sole qualifying body for licensing in public accountancy in Ontario. In addition to being responsible for the education and training of Ontario's Chartered Accountants, the institute, a self-regulating body under the Chartered Accountants Act, is also responsible for the professional conduct and discipline of its members and students.

The development of professional standards and the advancement of the accounting discipline are other prime responsibilities of the institute.

# Airport will qualify for grant

Huronia Airport will qualify for a subsidy of fifty per cent of its operating expenses under a Municipal Airport Maintenance Subsidy Program grant administered by the

Ministry of Transportation and Communications.

Airport commission chairman Bob Sullivan confirmed yesterday that "it looks like we'll qualify for \$12,500, or

the maximum grant." The Huronia District Airport falls into the category of an airport with less than 20,000 aircraft movements annually, and is thus eligible for grants to

cover one half of their deficit.

Each time an aircraft takes off or lands, it is counted as an aircraft movement.

The Municipal Airport Maintenance Subsidy

Program was "introduced to relieve municipalities of some of the financial burdens of operating an airport, and at the same time, to encourage an adequate level of airport maintenance."
