# Silver Band comes to Midland Church, park filled with sound of music..

Members of the Metropolitan Silver Band joined musical forces with the chancel choir of St. Paul's United Church to provide some stirring musical moments last weekend.

The Met plays concerts throughout Toronto and is part of outreach program of Toronto's Metropolitan United Church. Present bandmaster Alan Moody began his career playing cornet in the Met when he was 12 years old. Now as leader, he arranges and conducts the group in a varied repertoire which includes show tunes, classics and novelties.

Saturday night, in concert with the St. Paul's choir, the band played a wide variety of music including a Glenn Miller medley, waltzes from Die Fledermaus, selections from Tannhauser and a "Fairy Tale" in which the musicians assisted the

narrator with appropriate selections. St. Paul's choir, directed by Kathleen Mounter sang sacred and secular numbers, including How Great Thou Art and a group of selections from The King and I.

Cheryl Hobson of Sunnyside, whose father is a former Met member, played Amazing Grace on the bagpipes, accompanied by the band, later she piped herself down the aisle with Road to the Isles.

The musical highlight of the evening for performers as well as audience was a brilliant arrangement (Wilhousky) of Battle Hymn of the Republic, for choir, and band. Audience members joined in the last chorus.

The Met played at the morning service of worship at St. Paul's and was featured in a special ceremony in Little Lake Park later in the afternoon

when the Horticultural Society sponsored a memorial service for the late Margaret Duffett.

Mayor Ron Bellisle, natty in his official centennial suit, officially opened the Centennial Concert Friday night in the gym at ESPSS. Following a stirring arrangement of O Canada, played by the ESPSS concert band, young choristers from Corpus Christi School joined with singer/composer G. Allan Tuckler in a spirited performance of Penetanguishene's Centennial Song, written by Tucker.

The concert and junior bands provided a varied program under the direction of Richard Lamoureux, ESPSS music director. Trumpet soloists Patti Murphy, Charlie Cote and Simone DesRoches provided sparkling harmony in Leroy Anderson's Bugler's Holiday. Later

in the program, concertband member Teresa Puddicomb conducted the junior band in the Muppet Show Theme.

A sixteen piece dance band got toes tapping throughout the audience with four bright selections. Trumpeters Patti Murphy and Charlie Cote and sax players Tom Rankin and Greg Bush were featured soloists.

Three young vocalists -- Maureen Ferguson, Elaine Paulin and Lisa Robitaille -- added variety to the evening's entertainment.

When CKMP's Gary Greer climbed onstage to direct the senior band in Instant Concert, Jacqueline Limoges slung a regal red velvet cape around his shoulders, and promised that the band would treat him like a king. Certainly, Greer led the group with regal aplomb.
