Dock Lunch event chopped in half

The event will be played out on Saturday only. Dubeau sent out 25 applications for the competition, and was surprised that many teams simply weren't ready to field a team this early in the season. Still, the entries that are already in should provide for a good exhibition of softball. The first games will be played at 10 a.m., with Gignac's Muffler Shop (defending Georgian Bay league champions) meeting Craighurst, and the Penetanguishene Stoneleigh Pontiacs Junior squad taking on a club from Rama.

At 11:30, it'll be Therrien's Furniture meeting the powerful Elmvale Merchants Angels while Collingwood tangles with whoever the late entry will be. Admission is \$1 for the day. Along with the \$250 cash prize, the winning club will get a trophy.

Runner-up will scoop up \$175, the third-place squad will take home \$100 plus a consolation trophy and the fourth-place team will snag \$75.
