Take a bike

We all take our bicycles, whether child or adult, for granted. But this year we have reason to celebrate: cycling is 100 years old in Canada.

Most modern cyclists don't realize that 100 years ago the bicycle was instrumental in technological and sociological development. Bicycle research led to the invention of pneumatic tires, ball bearing, drum brakes and paved roads. The sociological impact was perhaps even greater; the bicycle led to increased mobility and increased social in-

teraction between all classes of people. Women used the bicycle as a new form of independence and an escape from chaperonage -- even women's clothing underwent a revolution with the appearance of bloomers and less restricting garments.

The Canadian Wheelmen's Association began in 1882 in St. Thomas, Ont. The CWA organized racing cyclists, the bicyclists' lobby and the hundreds of local clubs all over the province. Now renamed the Canadian Cycling Association and

located in Ottawa, this body co-ordinates Provincial Cycling Association, national competition, cross-country touring and cycling concerns.

The Ontario Cycling Association developed directly from the CWA. Today the OCA publishes an annual bicycle events calendar with over 30 races and 90 tours, offers sports equipment insurance to members and defends cyclists' rights.

Stop taking your bicycle for granted -- take it out of the basement or garage and show it a little sunlight!
