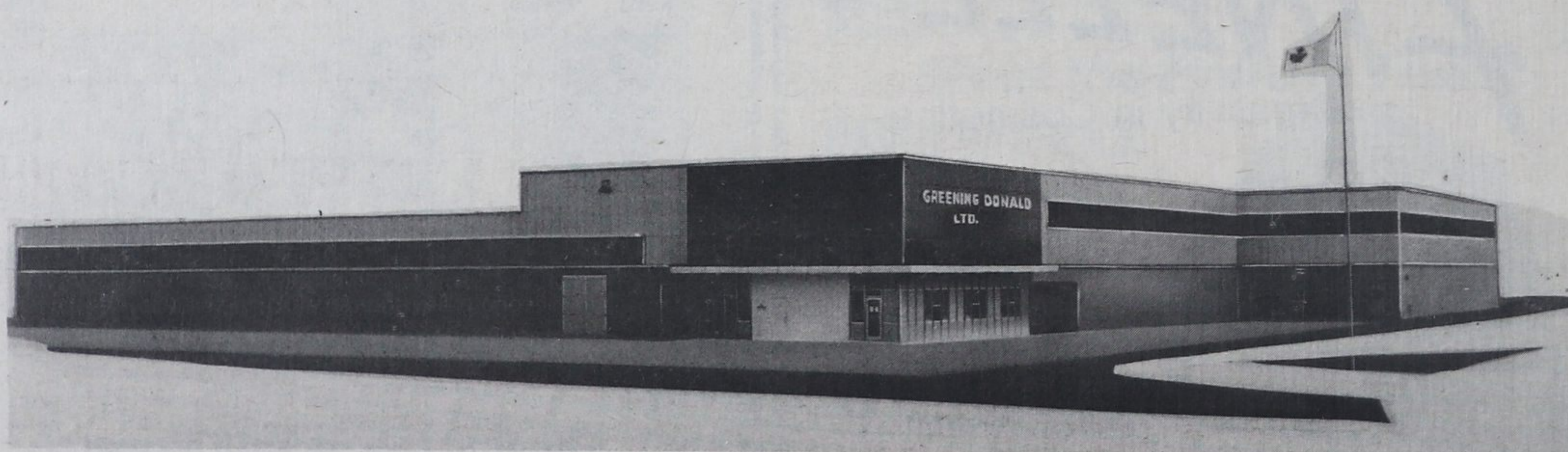
Your town's Who's Who
