Park Petition

A petition to have an empty lot at the bottom of the Poyntz Street hill turned into a park has been referred to council's housing and development committee. In discussing the request by area residents, council noted that a parkette between Dupuis Lane and Benson Street in the neighbourhood already exists. There is also a proposal for an additional park off Robert Street under consideration by the Arena, Parks and Recreation Board.

Overflow Monitor

An overflow monitoring device is to be installed at the Penetanguishene pollution control plant at the request of the Ministry of the Environment. The monitoring chamber will cost \$15,000, and will be paid for out of a current reserve of \$26,000. The overflow monitor will aid in

studies of water quality by the MOE.

Cruiser purchased

A recommendation by the Public Safety Committee to purchase a \$9,934 cruiser for the Police Department has been approved by Council. A. detailed study of the comparative costs of buying or leasing the new cruiser showed a \$1,112 saving by purchasing the new Chevrolet Impala.

The inquest into the death of a 14-year-old Grade 7 Scarborough boy who died in hospital two days after a skiing accident at Medonte Mountain Ski Resort March 3 has resulted in a recommendation that head injuries at ski resorts be reported to police.

Further recommendations were that a parent be aware of what level of skill a student rates himself on consent forms for school ski trips which parents are required to sign before the trip, and that students on a ski trip be given a lesson in downhill skiing before they are allowed on the slopes.

Coroner Dr. James Young of Elmvale described the three recommendations as sensible and reasonable. He said they could be followed without great cost, and that they could prevent problems in the future.

Daniel Markesini skied off the edge of a slope and died of internal head injuries. A pathologist testified that a helmet would not have helped because of the speed at which the boy was moving at the time of impact.
