Score comeback win in final

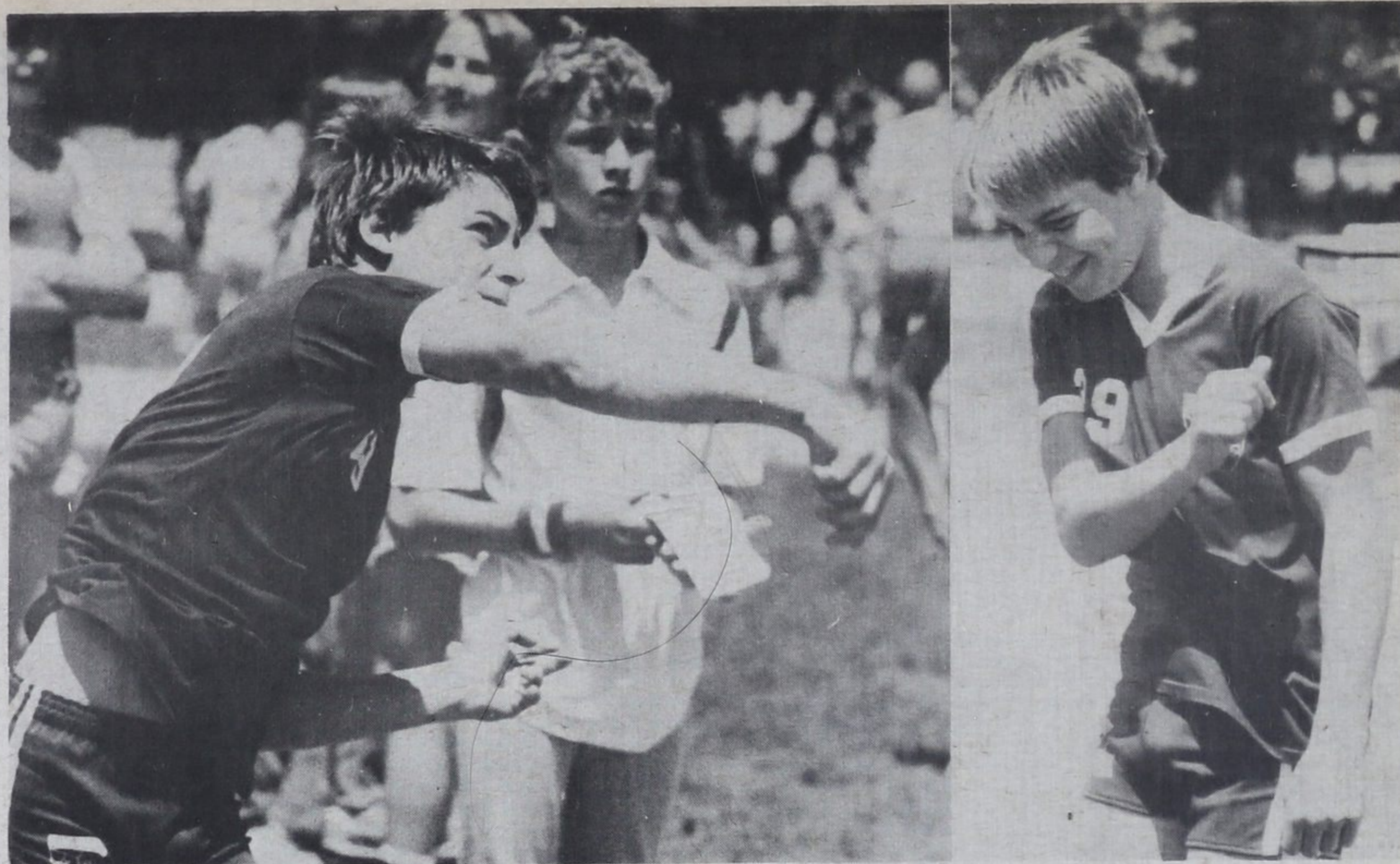
Orillia's Udell Sports beat Brechin 2-1 in a tense championship final at the annual Vasey Field Day fastball tournament Saturday in Vasey.
