Indusmin coach Malcolm Lonsdale figures his club controlled about 75 per cent of the play in the first half of Monday's clash.

Their persistence finally paid off when Andy Wicksted headed in a corner kick (the fifth for Indusmin to that point) into the left corner of the Italians' net.

The Italians roared back, though, and found the mark 15 minutes into the second half. Then, after halting a Midland breakaways, they put it away by putting another past Indusmin goaltender Dave Downs 16 minutes remaining.

"We just couldn't make the best of our chances," Lonsdale said. "But it was an excellent game."
