Midland Indusmin allowed two second-half goals while missing on several good chances of their own to drop a 2-1 decision to the Italian Sportsmen in Barrie and District Recreational Soccer League action Monday at Barrie's City Pitch. The loss was Indusmin's second of the season against one win and a pair of ties.

They'll be back at it tonight with a homefield encounter against Barrie Simcoe Block. Kick-off is slated for 7 p.m. at Midland Secondary School.

The Midland Autos, the other local BDRSL entry, are winless in four starts and will have a tough time cracking the barrier when they meet the tough Italian coub tonight in Barrie.

Indusmin coach Malcolm Lonsdale figures his club controlled about 75 per cent of the play in the first half of Monday's clash.

Their persistence finally paid off when Andy Wicksted headed in a corner kick (the fifth for Indusmin to that point) into the left corner of the Italians' net.

The Italians roared back, though, and found the mark 15 minutes into the second half. Then, after halting a few Midland breakaways, they put it away by putting another past Indusmin goaltender Dave Downs with 16 minutes remaining.

"We just couldn't make the best of our

chances," Lonsdale said. "But it was an excellent game."

Ernie Desroches was selected Midland's

player of the game by the referee.

Lonsdale commended Downs for his "wonderful diving saves" in

the second half and singled out Dean Wood as the club's most improved player to this point in the season.
