

# Mets dump Royals 7-5



The Elmvale Mets, on the hitting of Russ Stacey and Brian Belcourt, defeated the Vasey Royals 7 to 5 on June 21.

This game marked the return of Brian Belcourt to the Mets and he responded with three hits in three trips to the plate. He also crossed the plate three times. Stacey, too, connected for two doubles and one triple in three trips, while scoring once himself.

Elmvale took a 3-0 lead in the first inning, on hits by Kevin Steele, Belcourt and Stacey and a walk to second baseman Ike Columbus. The Mets added to their lead in the second when pitcher Bruce Graves stroked a triple and was brought home on a single by Columbus.

Vasey came charging back in the third inning, scoring four runs on five hits and one Met error.

Elmvale responded in their half of the third

with two runs. Belcourt led off with a single and scored on Stacey's second double of the game. Stacey advanced to third on a fly-out by Fred Spring and scored on a ground out to third by Geoff Kenney.

Elmvale's seventh run was scored by the combination of Belcourt and Stacey again. Belcourt led off with a double and was scored on a triple by Stacey. Vasey scored their fifth run in the sixth inning on a couple of walks and

two hits.

The Royals threatened in the seventh when the lead-off man reached first on a single; but this did not deter the Mets. A ground ball hit to Columbus was relayed to Steele and back to Stacey to extinguish the threat. Graves forced the next man to pop to second to end the game, for his second win against one defeat.

Last Thursday saw the Mets take on the other Vasey team, the Twin Lakes. This time

the Mets were not so lucky, losing 4-2.

Vasey took the lead in the fourth inning, 3-0, on two hits and one Elmvale error. This inning was highlighted by a home run by Vasey first baseman, Jim Beck.

Vasey's fourth run was scored in the fifth when shortstop Blake Edwards reached base on an error and was singled home by pitcher Bob Widdes.

Elmvale got on the board when rightfielder Doug Gillespie reached first with a single and

moved to second with a walk to Stacey.

Frankcom was inserted to run for Stacey. Pinch hitter Fred Spring then lined a single to right field, scoring Gillespie, while Frankcom was thrown out at the plate. Spring ended up at third when the dust had settled, and scored on a groundout to second by Brian Belcourt.

The Mets next game is Thursday at Wyebridge.

Their next home game is July 8 against Perkinsfield.

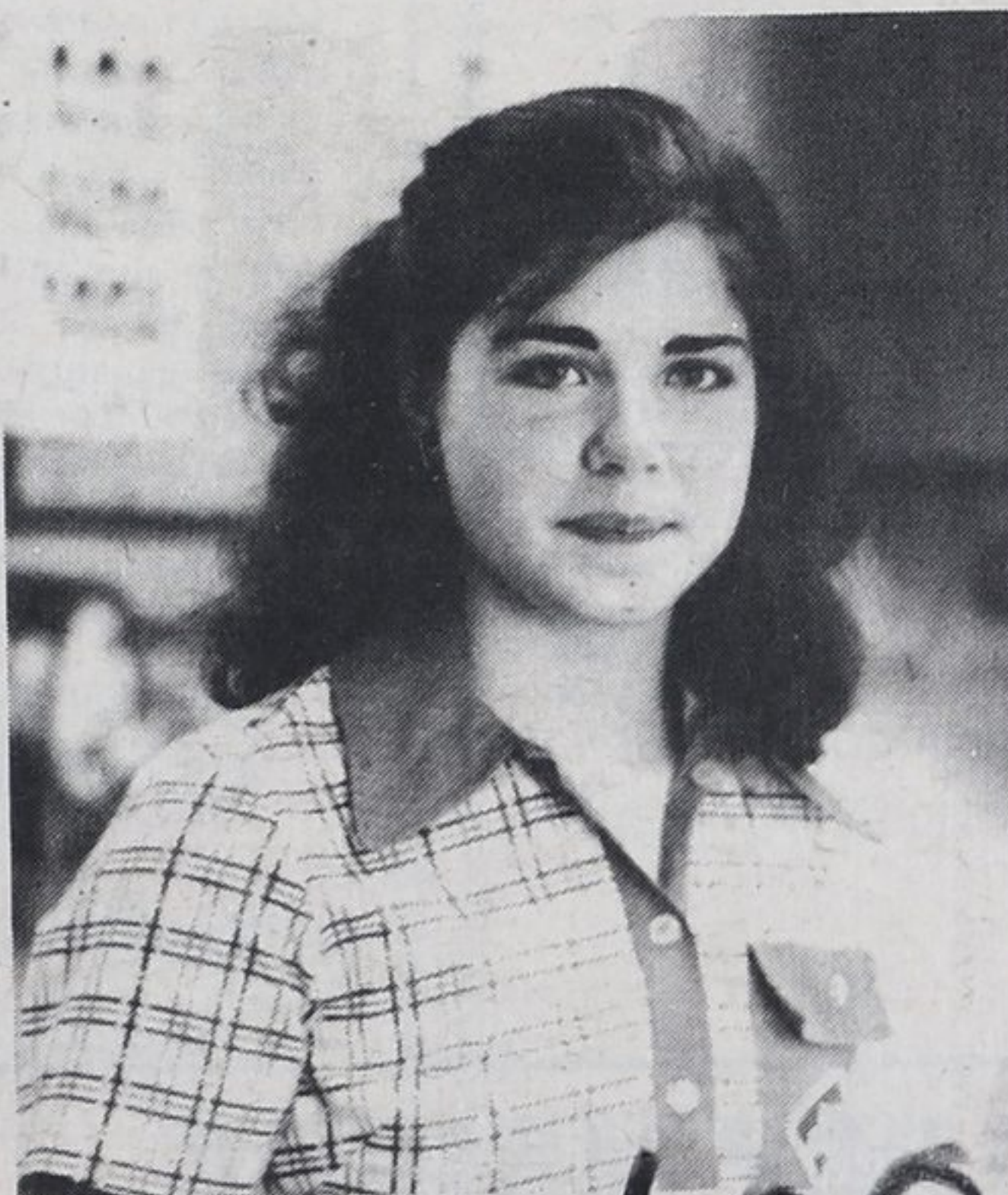

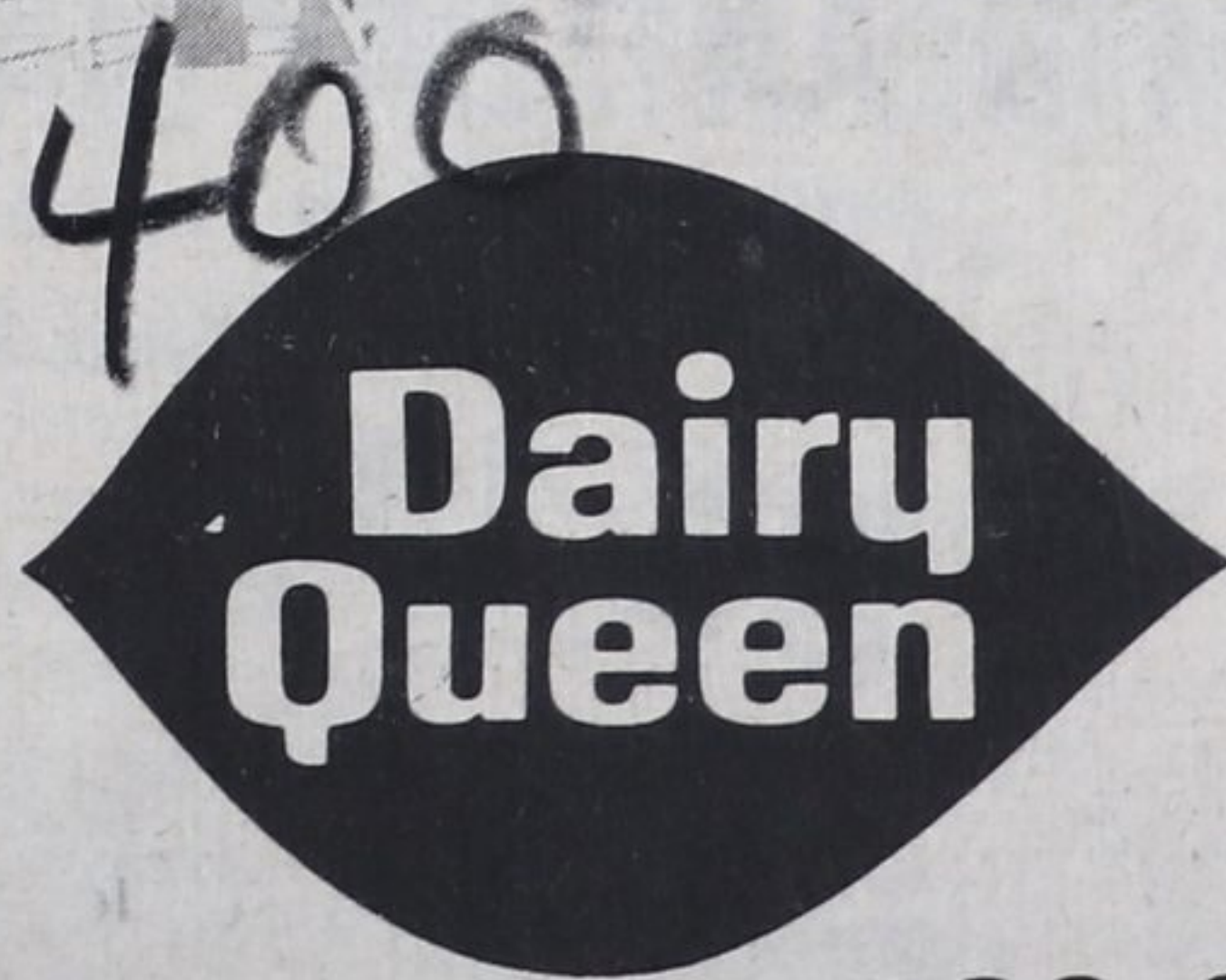
