Midland wheelchair athlete Ron Robillard will begin a five-day test beginning tomorrow as the 1982 Ontario Games for the Physically Disabled get underway in Sarnia.

This week's Ontario championship is a prestigious affair, but for Robillard it will serve for the most part as a warmup for the Pan-American Games in Halifax July 21-28.

Robillard, 17, earned a spot on the Canadian national team last month after a training camp in Halifax.

In both the Ontario and Pan-Am games, Robillard will compete in the 200, 400, 800 and 1,500 metre races.

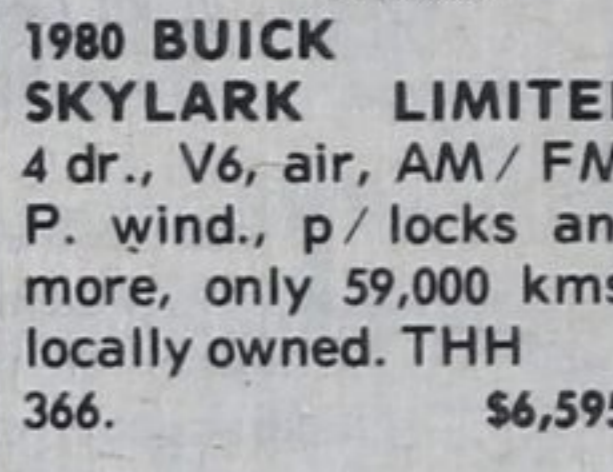
After the Ontario Games, in which he won six gold medals and one silver last year, Robillard will join the national team for another training workout in Toronto before setting out for Halifax.
