sentenced July 12 to one year probation and ordered to pay \$963 each in restitution after they

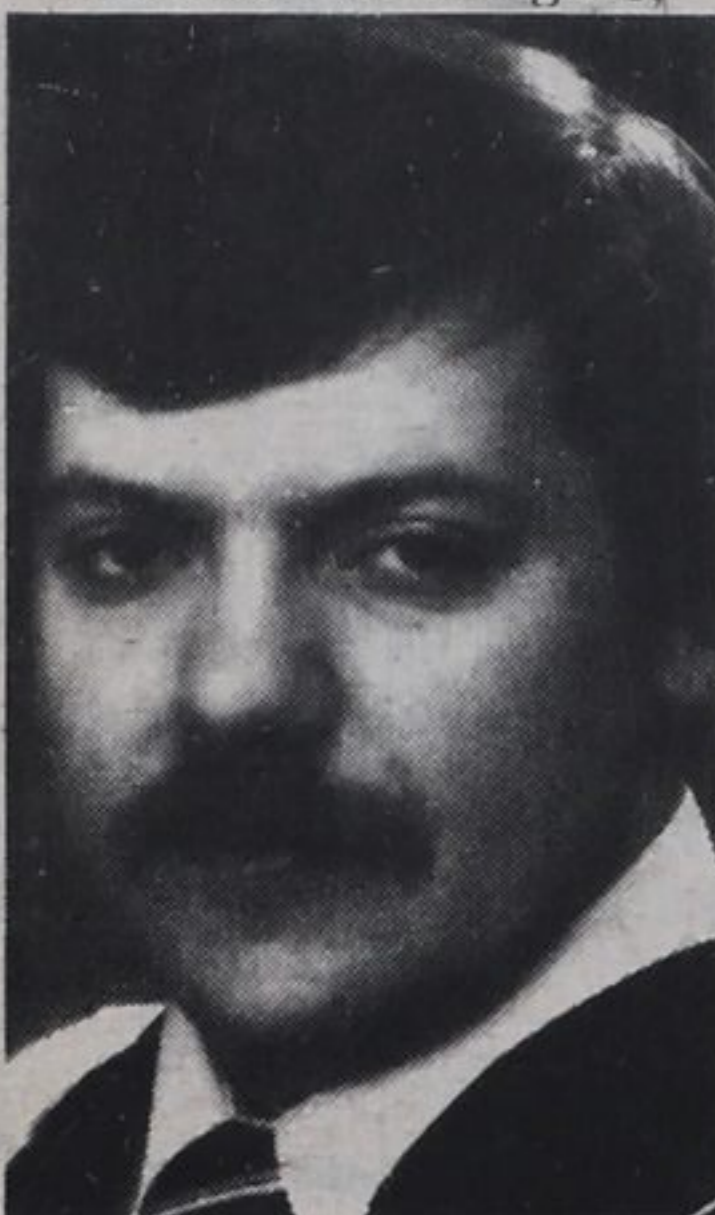
pleaded guilty to breaking more than a dozen trees earlier this year at McGuire Park.
