

Sabres, Don's stay alive

Join six top squads in PMBHL quarter-final openers tomorrow

The Surplus Plus Sabres and Don's Janitorial advanced into the Penetang-Midland Ball Hockey League semi-finals after elimination-round victories Monday at Penetanguishene Arena.

League play ended Sunday and the top six clubs, led by regular-season champion and league defending champion Ron's Confectionary, automatically gained entry into the quarter-final round.

The four clubs below them vied for the two other quarter-final spots and the 11th-place club,

the Mink Insurance Royals, were eliminated fight off the bat.

Now joining the Royals on the sidelines are M. Forget Construction, who dropped a 6-3 decision to the Sabres, and Duquette's TV, who were beaten 5-3 by Don's.

First games of the quarter-final series will get underway tomorrow night with the Sabres meeting Ron's at 6:45 p.m., Don's taking on the league's regular-season runner-up region Eagles at 8 p.m., Cumming-Nicholson facing the S. Charlebois Haulage Diggers at 9:15

p.m. and the Excalibar Islanders running up against the Stewart's Gulf Oilers at 10:30.

Martial Marion led the Sabres attack in Monday's sudden-death encounter by slapping in four goals. Andy Seeman and Vince Ladouceur each added one for the winners.

Pat Duval scored twice for Forget and Bryan Lethbridge had the other.

Paul Duval paced Don's charge with a pair of goals and singles were had by Rick Ladouceur, Mich McCormick and Brian Rambler.

Rick Rever, Brian Garner and Don Meech each notched one for Duquette's.

In Sunday's schedule-closing games, the Islanders edged Duquette's 3-2, Ron's were cuffed to a 2-2 tie with the Oilers, the Eagles eked a 5-4

decision from Don's, Cumming-Nicholson hammered the Sabres 11-4 and the Diggers scored a win by default over the Royals.

John Pickett, Keith Press and Greg St. Amant each scored one to help the Islanders to their win. Pat Brodeur and Rick Rever replied for Duquette's.

Ron's marksmen were Dan O'Hara and Brian Pilon. Gary Hansford and Ken Mitchell responded for the Oilers.

Brian Rambler connected for two for Don's and Paul Duval and Dave Miller accounted for the others.

Jerry Ladouceur scored three times for the Eagles and singles were had by Joe Beausoleil and Jamie Robitaille.
