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ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT BOARD NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING TOWN OF PENETANGUSHENE PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION OF A SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT

The Ontario Ministry of the Environment has received an application from the Town of Penetanguishene, 10 Robert Street West, Penetanguishene, Ontario, for approval of the construction of a sewage treatment plant, which would service the north end of the Town of Penetanguishene, consisting of an inlet pumping station, a grit removal tank and grit classifier, a modular contact stabilization - extended aeration sewage treatment plant, a chemical storage tank for phosphorus removal, together with a control building housing air blowers, a standby diesel generator, chlorination and chemical feed equipment, together with a new outfall into Penetanguishene Harbour. The sewage treatment plant is proposed to be located approximately 1950 feet north of the intersection of Fox and Yeo Streets (Lot 121, Registered Plan 70), on property presently owned by the International Cooperaage Company of Canada Limited. The effluent from the plant is to be discharged to Penetanguishene Harbour through a 16-inch diameter outfall.

The Environmental Assessment Board will conduct a public hearing to obtain information and to hear the views of the public so that it can make recommendations in respect of the proposed sewage works. Written and oral submissions may be made to the Board at the hearing. The Board will not consider any submissions regarding the proposal after the hearing has been closed.

The hearing will be held on Tuesday, August 10, 1982, at 10:00 o'clock in the morning, local time, in the Council Chambers, Town of Penetanguishene, 10 Robert Street, West, Penetanguishene, Ontario.

Plans of the proposed sewage works will be available for examination and inspection during normal business hours in the office of the Clerk of the Town of Penetanguishene, 10 Robert Street West, Penetanguishene, Ontario, and in the office of the Environmental Assessment Board, 5th Floor, 1 St. Clair Avenue West, Toronto, Ontario.
