Presents anti-gun control petition from constituents

Doug Lewis, deputy opposition house leader and MP for Simcoe North last week presented, on behalf of his constituents, a petition opposing the passage of Bill C-451.

Bill C-451 which deals with gun control, calls for the licensing of all firearms, including those possessed prior to 1978 when the present Firearms Acquisition Certificate came into effect.

"The petitioners feel that the passage of Bill C-451 would infringe upon the rights and privileges of law abiding citizens who own and use firearms for legitimate purposes", stated Lewis.

The present gun control section of the Criminal Code is cumbersome, expensive to administer, and does not really restrict the use of firearms. The Progressive Conservative Government had set up a parliamentary committee to conduct a full public review of this legislation. However, the committee never had an opportunity to proceed. To date, the Liberal Government has refused to allow a review of the legislation.
