

Tykes taken out in 2 straight

The Midland Gervan, Jones and Davy Tykes fell victim to a potent Barrie club and were eliminated in two straight games of their best-of-three York-Simcoe Baseball League semi-final series late last week.

The Tykes wound up their season with a 10-1 loss in the opening game last Thursday at Little Lake Park and a 10-3 loss the next night in Barrie.

Dave Duval took the loss in the first game and Jimmy McLaren was tagged in the second.

David Chalmers scored Midland's lone run Thursday and Ken Haseneier, with two, and Trevor Irvine, counted for the club in

Friday's game.

"We played well," said coach manager Robert Marchand, "but Barrie just has too much depth in their pitching."

The North division won the game 9-5, helped by Midland's Albert Miller and Kent Haseneier, who scored two runs apiece, and Dave Duval, who came up with some top-notch hitting.

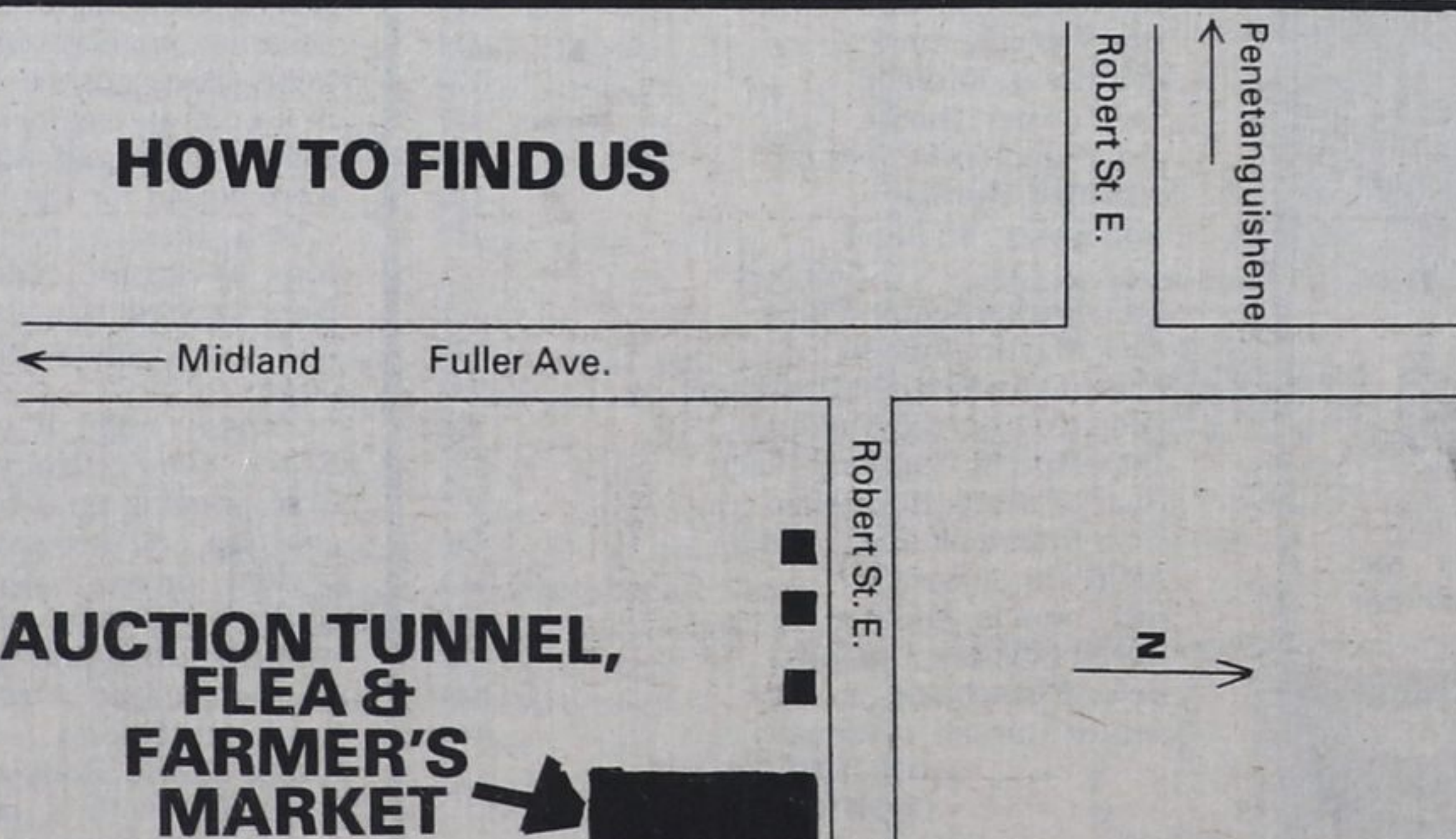

Advantage Tennis

There you are, just finished the third round of your club tournament and you've won! You've worked harder on your game this year than most and the results are beginning to show. You just beat a player in a close match that could have gone either way and last year you probably would have lost it.

But now you're up against Smokin' Joe in the quarters and you've never beaten him before.

You're actually quite happy you made it this far and are really only hoping to make tomorrow's match look decent rather than actually win. How often this scenario is repeated.!

The next time you find yourself in such a situation or indeed in one where you only give yourself a fifty-fifty chance of winning why not try a little mental rehearsal? Imagine the match as closely as possible—the location, weather, courts, spectators etc. Visualize in your mind you and Joe walking out on the court, the spin, the warm-up, practice serves and the first few games. Imagine his booming seves coming down at you and you returning them accurately. Imagine the match progressing with you slowly gaining control. It's very important to see yourself winning in your mental match and to have a positive image of your game and potential. Create the entire match as closely in your mind as possible right up to match point which of course you win and then you're at the net shaking hands. Close your eyes and concentrate deeply for 5 or 10 minutes while doing your practice match. If you can mentally visualize winning beforehand it will be that much easier to do in reality. If you do it seriously it will add greatly to your confidence, and everyone knows confidence is half the battle in winning tennis matches.
