The Atom sets will continue Tuesday with Asselin meeting Summer's at 6:15 p.m. and Jug City and Bay Pharmacy matching up an hour later.

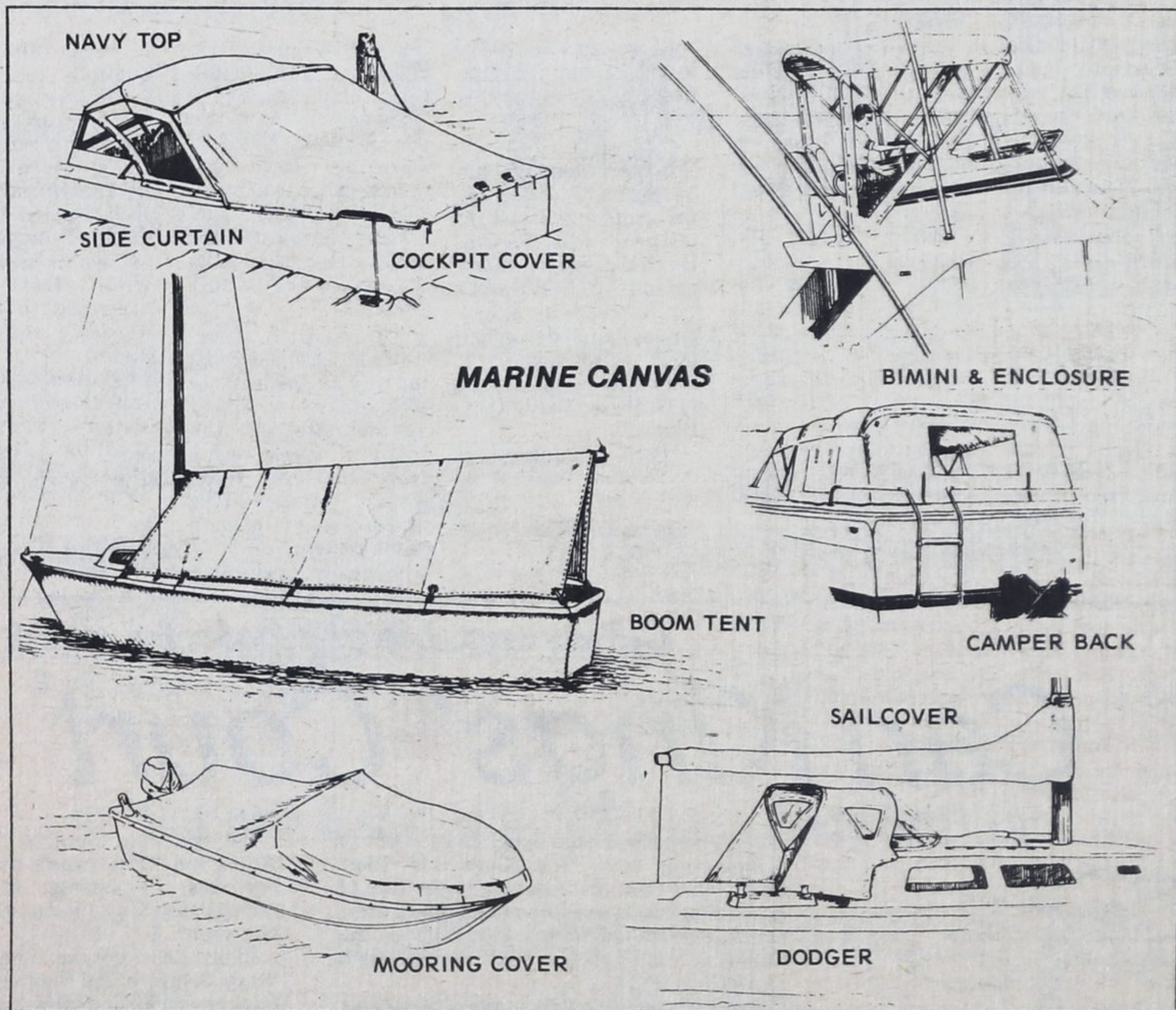
