# 44,000 volt line is in the works

Ontario Hydro forces have started construction of a 44,000 volt line from Port Severn to Honey Harbour. Scheduled for completion in March 1983, the line is being built to provide more reliable service to customers in the Honey Harbour area.

"This area is presently serviced by a 12 km line built in 1938 which runs across country from Big Chute", says John Winchester, Manager of Georgian Bay Region's Distribution Systems. "Many of the poles in this line are in poor condition and there are sections where the conductor has deteriorated because of age. This has caused a number of serious outages to the Honey Harbour area over the last couple of years. These have been extended on occasion by the inaccessibility of the line because of its

The new line will follow old Highway 11 from Port Severn, cross

the Severn River beside the old bridge, then follow Muskoka Road 5

to Honey Harbour.

It will replace an existing rural pole line

which follows this route. These rural lines will be transferred to the

new poles as part of the project.

Cost will be just under \$1 million. The new line will be easily accessible for any needed repairs and will be built to present day standards assuring more reliable service to the Honey Harbour area.
