Inquest won't be called hanging death at Oak Ridge

The third death in less than two months occurred at Penetanguishene Mental Health Centre, on Sunday.

Stuart Bomberry, 24, is said to have used a bedsheet to hang himself from window bars in D. Ward at Oak Ridge between 7:05 p.m. and 7:13 p.m., Midland OPP report.

A post mortem was not conducted. An inquest is not planned. Dr. Robert Besley was the coroner.

Another inmate of Oak Ridge, Stanley Carson, 32, died in his cell on Aug. 23. A post mortem concluded that Carson asphyxiated. The coroner in that case, Dr. Herman Jilesen, decided that an inquest will be held, but a date has not been announced.

Recently the drowned body of a woman resident of the Mental Health Centre was recovered from the bay bordering the health centre grounds.

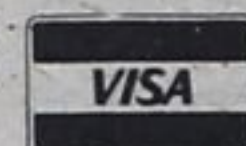
