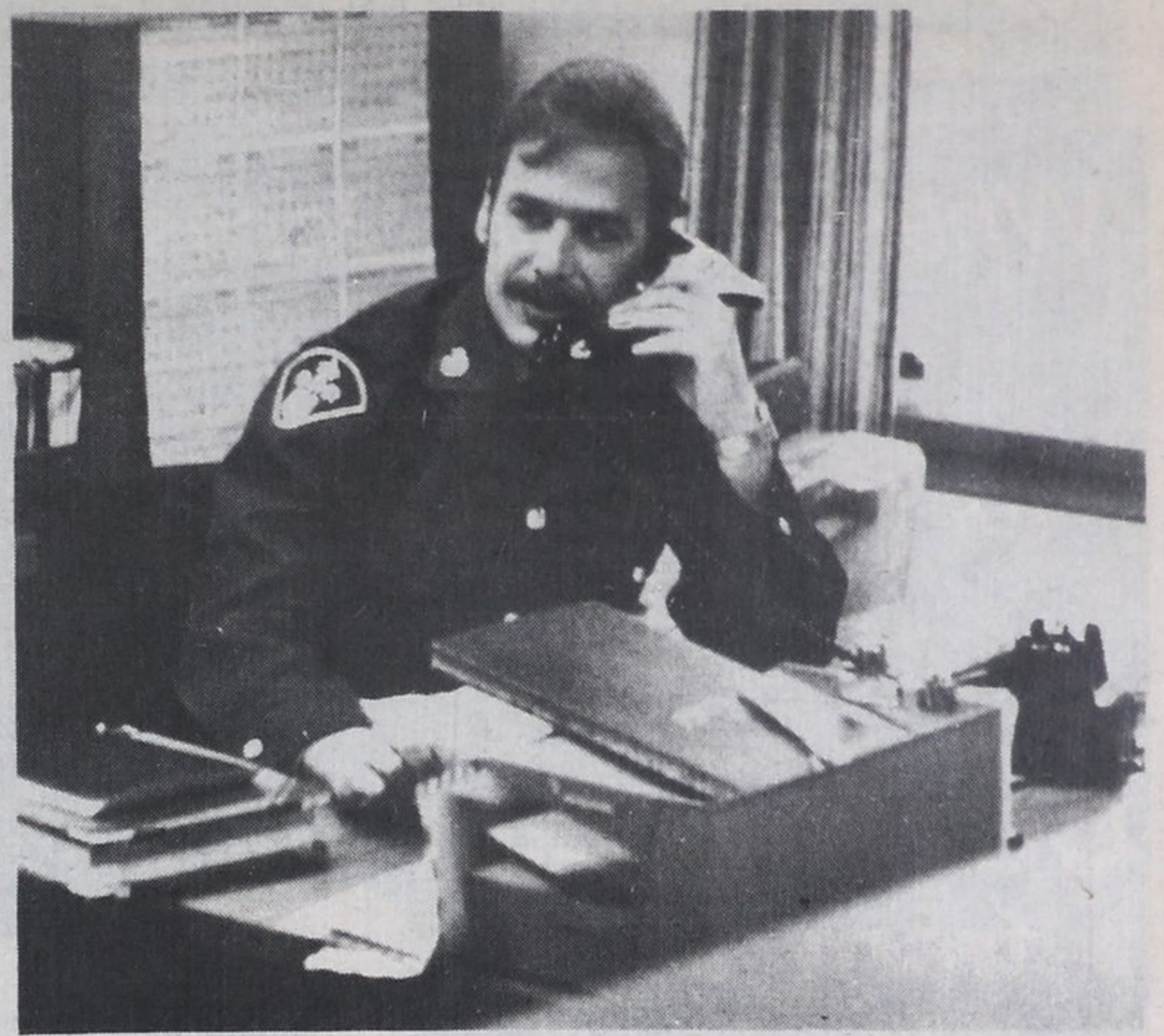


Their chance to achieve

Federal funds for Friends of Trent-Severn Waterway

J. C. Christakos, director of Parks Canada, Ontario Region, presented a cheque for \$64,000 on behalf of the Hon. John Roberts, minister of the environment, to the recently formed co-operating association, Friends of the Trent-Severn Waterway.

A registered charitable organization, the Friends' membership is open to individuals interested in assisting the Trent-Severn Waterway in fulfilling its mandate as a Heritage Canal.

The association was incorporated at a public meeting in Peterborough on June 16 of this year. The sixteen member Board of Directors and executive were elected at that time. Three committees were also struck; a Selection Committee that will

recommend the acquisition of goods to sell at designated outlets along the waterway, a Membership and Publicity Committee, and a Projects Committee that will work on long range planning.

F.T.S.W. chairman Charles Huffman said funds provided by Parks Canada will be used to acquire sales inventory and to further promote the rapidly growing membership in all the communities along the 400 kilometer waterway.

Co-operating Associations have operated successfully in the United States since the 1920's where more than 250 sales outlets are maintained in various parks within the U.S. National Parks Service.

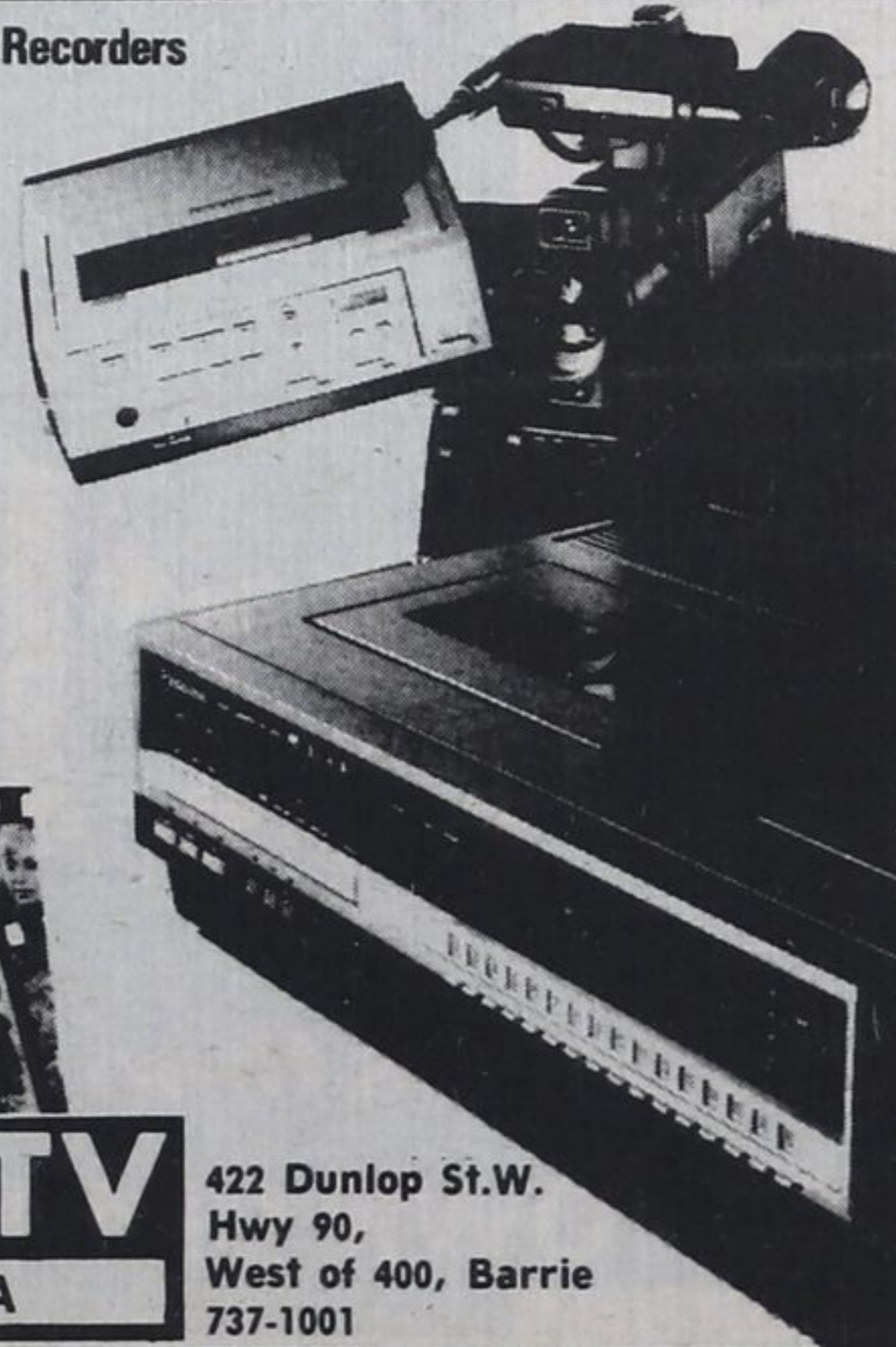
