Midland's Sacred Heart School was third with 460 team points, Parkview of Midland was fourth with 659, Christian Island was fifth at 717, Huron Park of Midland was sixth at 831 and Perkinsfield's Ecole Des Saintes Martyrs Canadiens was seventh at 877.

Best time of the day was posted by Derek Bowering of Parkview, who beat out two St. Joseph's runners by covering the 3 km. distance in nine minutes, 35 seconds.

Denis Laurin of Msgr. Castex topped the Senior girls' section by beating 52 other contestants in the time of 11:15. Betty Cousineau of Our Lady of Mercy was second and Jenny Robertson of Port McNicoll was third.

The biggest division was the 77-entrant Intermediate boys' class, won by Allan Keery of Huron Park in the time of 10:02. David Northcott of St. Joseph's was second and Don Monteith of Bayview was third.

Top Intermediate girls' runner was Monica Rekola of Victoria Harbour, who beat 67 other girls in 11:11. Jodi Lalonde of Sacred Heart was second and Michelle Cadieux of Msgr. Castex was third.

Best of the 64 Junior boys was Trevor Irvine of Monseigneur Castex, who posted a time of 10:45. Second in the division was Andrew Bowers of Sacred Heart and third was David Forrest of Msgr. Castex.

Heather McGregor proved to be the quickest in the 59-entrant Junior girls' class, defeating second-place Sean Ferguson of St. Joseph's and third-place Linda Hay of Parkview with a time of 12:04.
