Our county levies due dates changed

The first October council meeting of Tiny Twp. was postponed from its usual hour of 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. on Wednesday, because of an unusually short agenda.

There were no delegations to council. The County of Simcoe has proposed that due dates for County levies

be amended to March 31, June 30, Sept. 30 and Dec. 15.

It is estimated that this move will save the County \$60,000 annually in bank borrowing costs. Levies are currently due in June, Sept. and December.

A majority of municipalities must agree to the proposed due dates. County council hopes to deal with the subject at the November 16th session.

Meanwhile excellent progress has been reported on the street naming and house numbering project in the Township. The area of the Tiny Beaches Road South has been completed, and \$4,040. has been paid to Art Dyer and Ted Goodwin for this portion of the job.

Kirk Ure, Co-Chairman of the Summerama Committee, C.B.O. Parks and Recreation Association, has written to thank Reeve Darby for cutting the ribbon at the opening ceremony of the recent Balm Beach Summerama. He also thanked the Administrator for providing picnic tables for the event.

Money earned at the Summerama was used for the development of parks and other recreational facilities in our area. The event was termed "very successful" in Mr. Ure's letter.

Midland Industries, Division of Waltec Inc., and Local 1476 of the Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union announced yesterday the signing and ratification of a new two year Collective Agreement.

This agreement is effective Sept. 20, 1982 and terminates Sept. 19, 1984.

The basic wage will increase by five percent on all rates effective Sept. 20, 1982, and 25 cents an hour effective Sept. 20, 1983.

The existing Cost of Living Allowance will continue, up to a maximum of 40 cents in each year.

A number of benefit items were altered including one more paid holiday, commencing in 1983.
