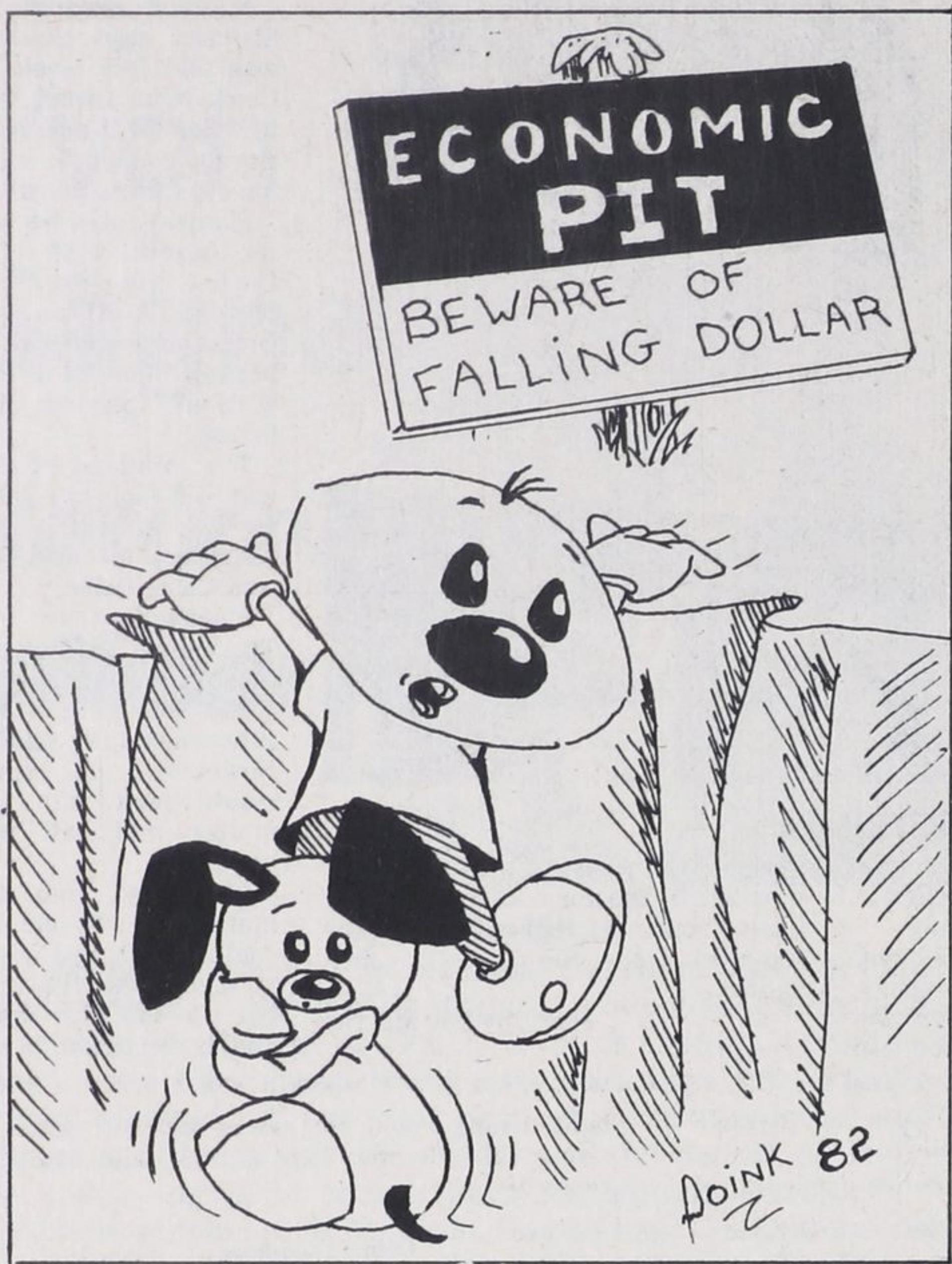

Witnesses wanted Re: Murder in June 1975

Karen Robinson was murdered in her home at Alcona Beach, 8th Line Innisfil, on June 25, 1975 about 4:30 a.m. Two men matching the description of her murderers were seen in Barrie the night before her murder at 8:00 p.m. One man was tall, the other short. The tall man wore jean-style clothing and red Adidas shoes. He was extremely loud, abusive and violent. The short man wore a brown jacket and jeans. Both men were obviously high on drugs and were dangerous. They drove a Gremlin-type car or an odd-shaped car with a faulty muffler. They were from Penetanguishene.
