recruiting techniques. Lady Finelle is a Haverhill, Massachusetts-based direct sales company.

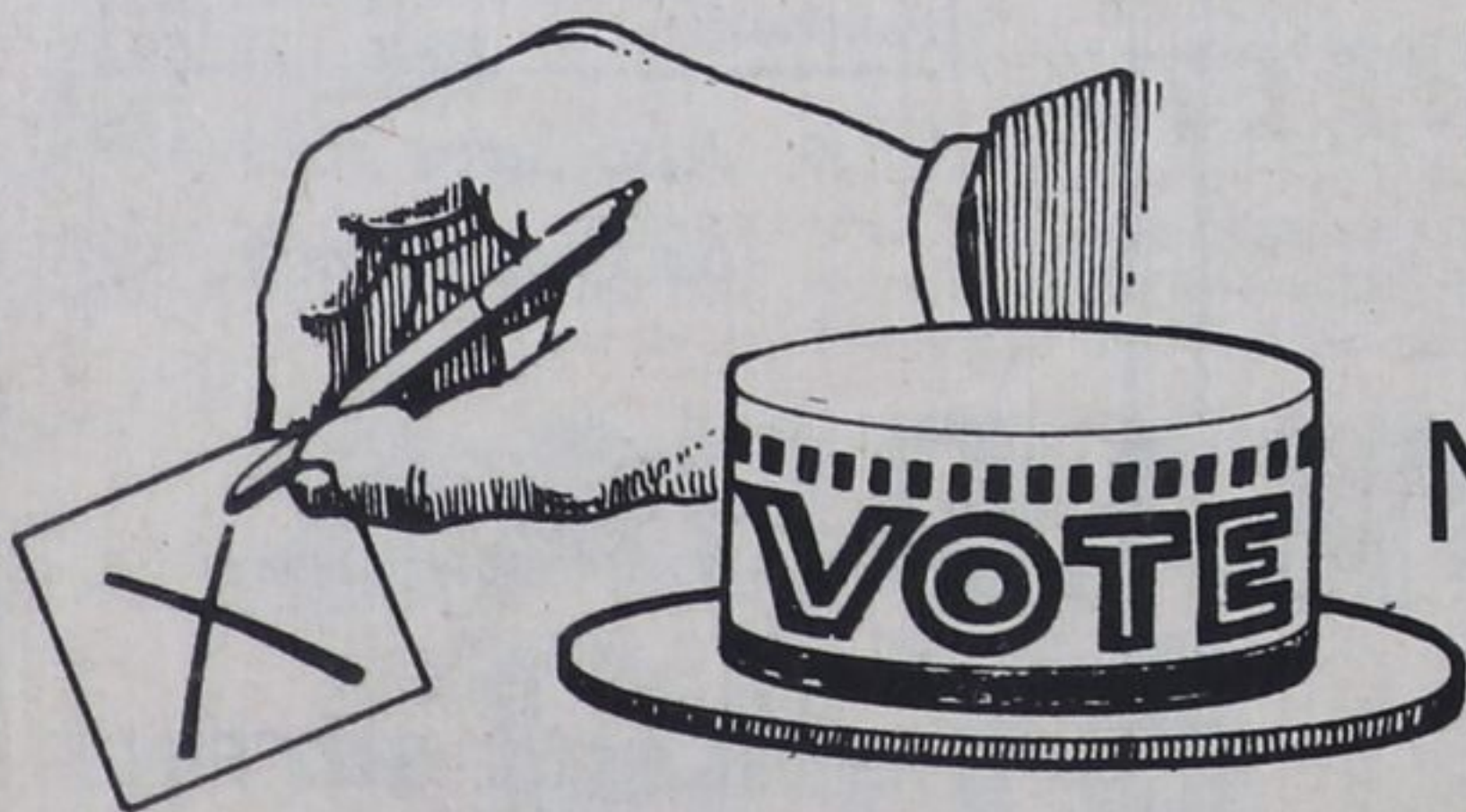
### MSS students honored Nov. 15

### May he or shall he?

Deputy-reeve Frances St. Amant presented a schedule of rules and regulations for the operation of the Auxiliary Police Force, to be approved by council Monday night, but withdrew it when she discovered a problem with the wording in one of the clauses. The report returns to committee for clarification.

The offending clause reads, "The services of any member of the Auxiliary Police Force may be terminated by the council of the town of Penetanguishene on the recommendation of the chief of police if the future service is considered undesirable or unnecessary." Deputy-reeve St. Amant wanted the word "may" changed to "shall".

It was argued by several councillors that such a change would compel council to fire a member on the chief's recommendation. Deputy-reeve St. Amant thought that was the intention of the clause. She said that to have it read "may" undermines the authority of the chief.

After a lengthy debate on the meanings of the words "may" and "shall" in this context, the report was returned to committee for further study.
