Five-Day Plan a way to stop smoking

Due to popular demand smokers who want to kick the habit will have their chance next week. A special Five-Day Plan will be conducted here by a physician-pastor team at the Midland Secondary School.

The Plan consists of regular group therapy sessions, films, and a daily personal control program. The Five-Day Plan has successfully helped many people quit smoking during the past 20 years.

Conducting the program locally will be Dr. E.R. Camunias and Pastor H.G. Fischbacher. Group therapy sessions will be held at 7:30 p.m. each evening beginning Monday, November 15 1982 at the Midland Secondary School on Hugel Avenue.

Sponsored by the Simcoe County Interagency Council on Smoking and Health and the Seventh-day Adventist

Church, of Ontario, as a community service, the Five-Day Plan aims to help improve the health of the community by showing how to meet the smoking habit on all levels of life and how to win, Fischbacher explains.

Held successfully in cities across Canada, the Five-Day Plan features such topics as the psychological and physical aspects of the habit, how craving can be lessened, how willpower can be strengthened, physical effects of smoking, and many other techniques designed to break the habit within a five-day period.

A feature will be the film "Count-down," depicting a full-colour a lung cancer operation, to be shown Monday night, November 15, the first evening of the therapy session.
