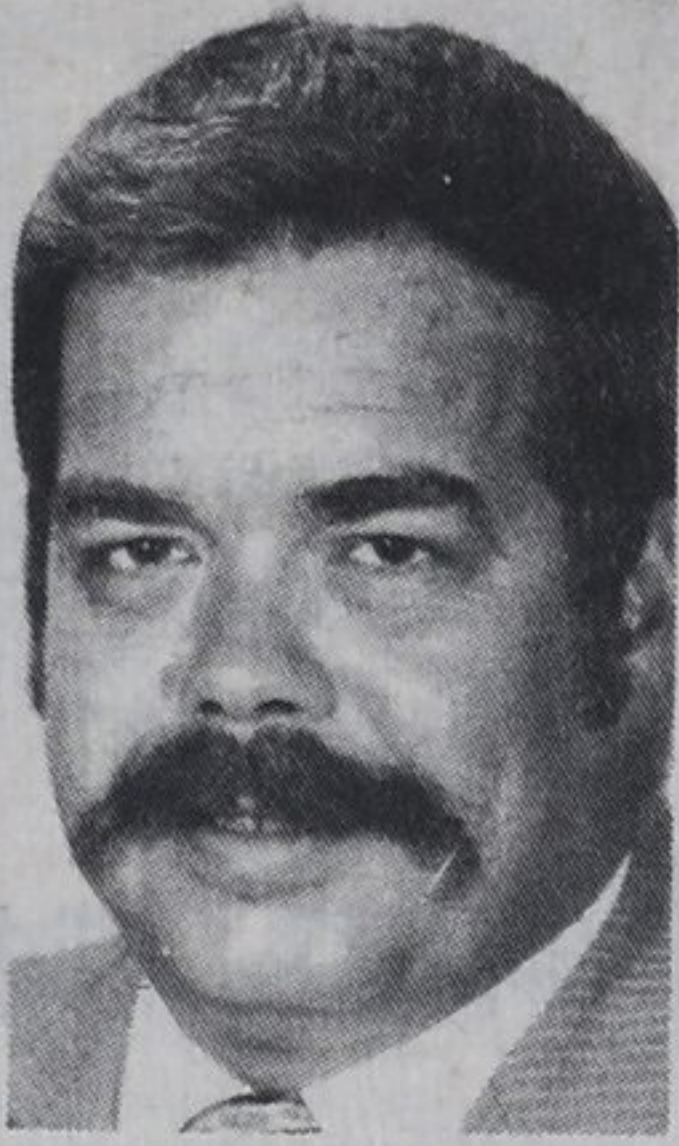


David Walker wants to be re-elected Tay's reeve

I would like to thank The Midland Times for this opportunity to address the voters of the Township of Tay where I am seeking to be returned as Reeve.



I will give you one example of what I mean when I say "Make every dollar do 100 cents work". Almost half the homes in Tay are served by communal water systems. Sunnyside, Portage Park, Midland Bay Woods, and the new system in Waubaushene

are the responsibility of Tay Township. Bayberry, Gilwood Bay and Glenbrook Gardens are soon expected to be operated by the Township.

In 1979 a study commissioned by Tay Council to report on the feasibility of setting up a full time water dept. This study showed that with some long term capital financing and the involvement of all the water areas, it would be feasible to equip and man a proper

Water Dept. to give assured service to our communal water systems.

But since Tay Council has entered into an agreement with the Waubaushene PUC to administer, operate, and maintain the new system there, (I should add that "as long as our Waubaushene Ratepayers are properly served by this agreement it will continue"), and since we regularly meet with our counterparts in Tiny Township to discuss

mutual concerns. Tay council has entered into an agreement with Tiny to share the services and costs of Tiny's already established, well equipped and manned Water Dept.

This agreement provides assured service of this vital commodity to our ratepayers on communal water systems. It allows Tiny to further improve service to their ratepayers. This agreement puts your water dollars to efficient use by sharing a water dept. with our neighbours instead of duplicating it.

I ask for your mandate to continue this kind of "money common sense". In offering myself as candidate to be returned as Reeve of Tay Township, I offer hardworking—experienced—leadership dedicated to fair representation of all Tay people.

I believe in common sense local government for equal benefit of all. I practice leadership in

the way the Captain of a hockey team tries to achieve its objectives, not in the way the captain of a ship

commands its course. I ask for your mandate to continue this kind of common sense, even handed leadership of Tay Township.

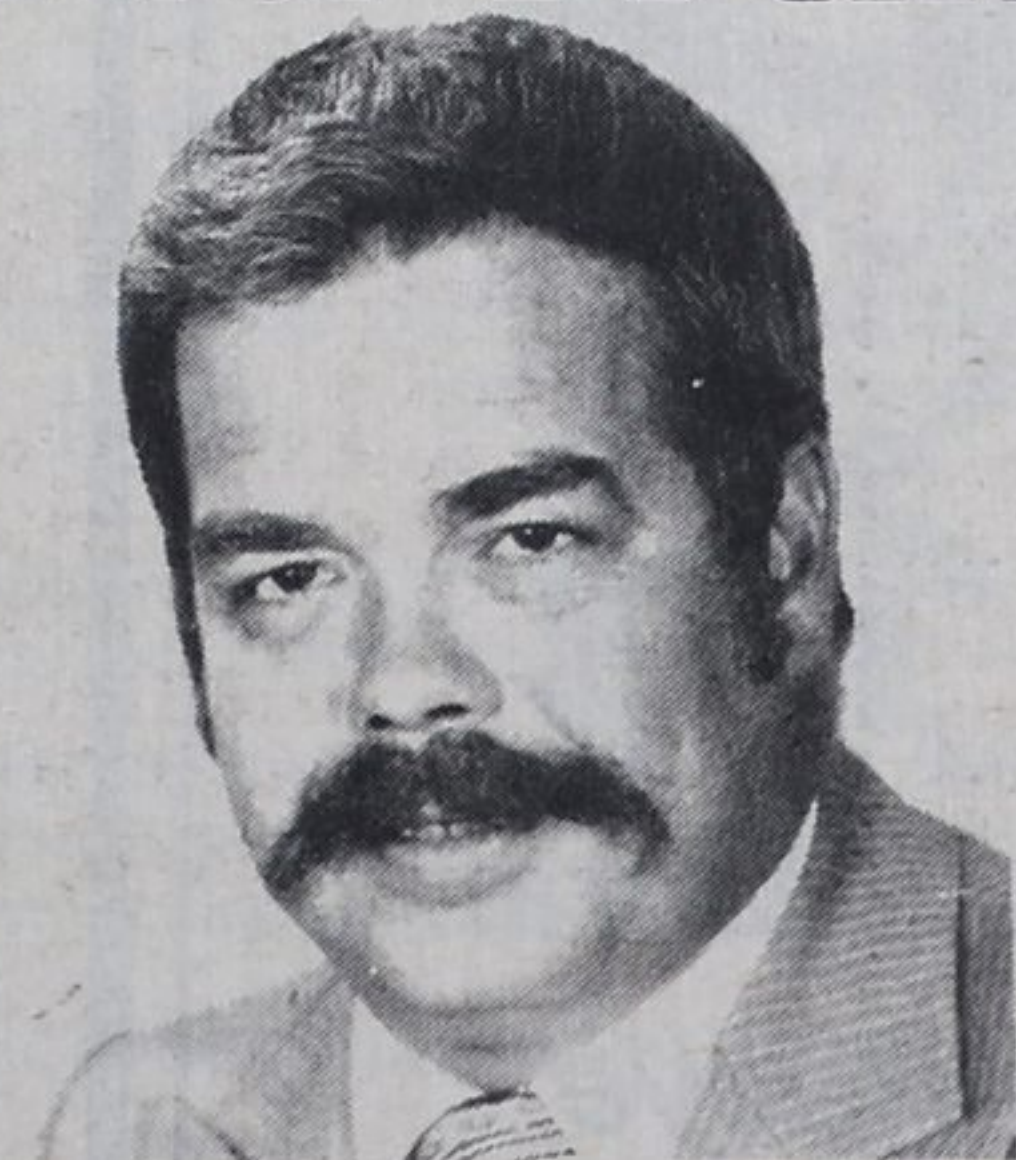
