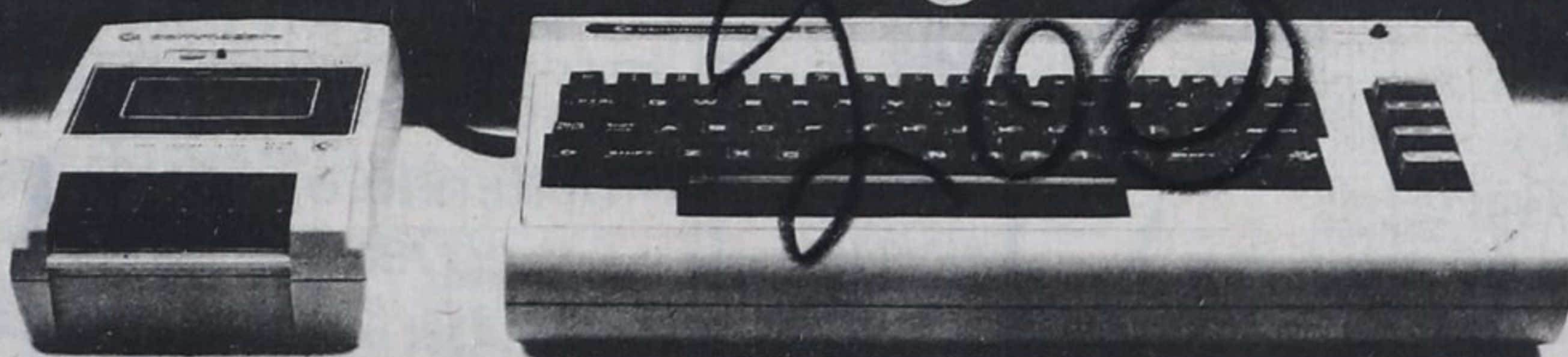

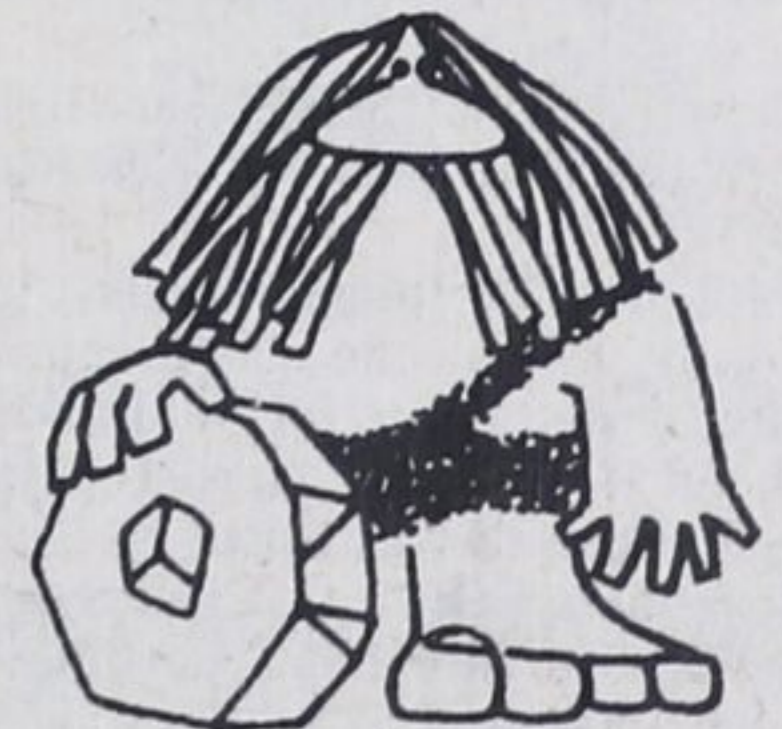
To T.B. from last week's quiz, the only Victorias I found who won the cup were from Winnipeg, not Montreal.
