The addition of Bice has given the team a real shot in the arm. The little forward has added enthusiasm to the A's, and his scoring prowess is badly needed. Don't expect four points per game from him, but he'll get his share of the action.

Carl Cowan also helped himself to a big night against Flyers as he set up four goals.

A's outshot Barrie by 42-31 in the game, and were full value for their win on offence anyway. Overall team defence lacked a lot, and goaltender John Duval was the main victim. He was lifted after surrendering three Flyers' goals in the opening five minutes of the game. Not all of that was Duval's doing however, and the move was more designed to inspire the team than to blame him.

Friday's loss to Raiders was not as bad as it might have been. A's were without Wayne King, Terry Spiker and Ken Knapton due to different reasons.

Craig Watson played net as Raiders outshot A's by 51-17.
