

Impressive win

Cents down Essa...now aim for Kings

Midland Centennials scored perhaps their most important, and most impressive win of the season on Tuesday evening at Centennial Arena. They dropped Essa 80's 6-3, two nights after 80's took the measure of Penetanguishene Kings 8-2.

Cents' win re-establishes the team as a legitimate contender for the Southern Division flag in the Georgian Bay Junior C League. John Walter continued his torrid scoring pace of late with three goals. That gives him nine goals in his last three games. Rick Rever who was slashed on the elbow in Saturday's win over Haliburton, came back to play a fine game and contribute two goals to the win. Steve Bressette scored the other Midland goal.

According to manager Doug Fox, the win was a total team effort. "Our boys played strongly in most areas of the game, they hit well, forechecked strongly and the defence moved the puck up very well."

Midland outshot their guests by a 39-30 margin, and deserved the pre-Christmas win. Essa tried some of the intimidating tactics that brought them success against Penetanguishene, but Cents played with composure and poise, preferring to avoid senseless confrontations. Blue-line ace Joe Beleskey threw his weight around with authority in the early going, and was the target of some retaliatory attacks later. When provoked into a fight in the second period, Joe refrained from an opportunity to really unload on his adversary. Although he was ejected for the

fight, it could have been much worse.

In his absence, the defence corps played solidly for the latter half of the game. This is particularly true of John Webb, who earlier had gotten away from his best game, but has resurfaced in the last two games especially.

Cents now are tuning up for Sunday's key game with rival Penetanguishene Kings.

"We seem to be hitting our stride right at the best time. Kings will be a good test for us. They have come off two disappointing games and should be ready for us. On the other hand,

we are on an upswing and will be hoping to keep it going."

C-NOTES...disappointingly, Brian Garner has left the team...says he has lost interest after not getting sufficient ice...Rob Greenlaw will sit for the next three games after getting the heave-ho for a flagrant
