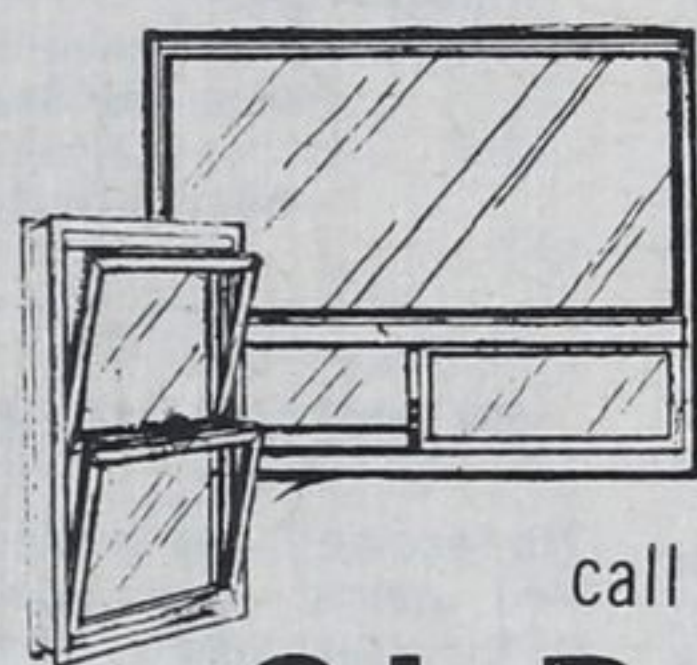
Ada Adamson married her late husband Fred

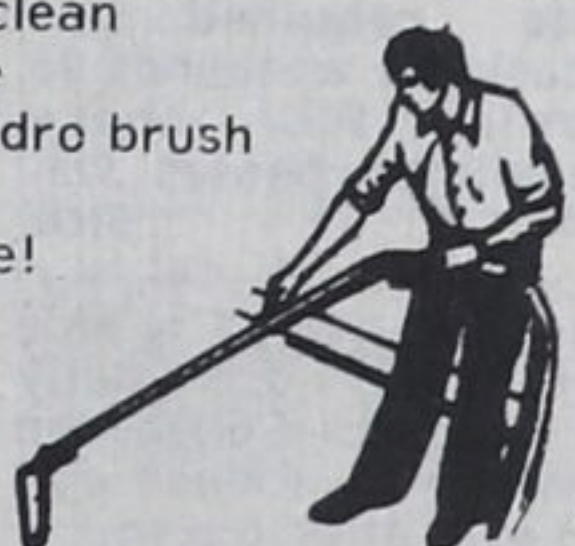
