property be connected to municipal services.

It was stressed the developers of the project weren't opposed to using municipal services once they

became available. The main problem, it was noted, as access to the highway.

MTC wouldn't give approval since originally Midland's Official Plan showed

that in time there would be internal roads built to serve future development.

Budget increase a disappointment:Warden

Simcoe County Warden Art Stewart is disappointed that the 1983 county budget is higher than the 1982 county budget.

However, the increase was kept to five per cent, he says, and anything less would have meant the county would have had to reduce subsidies and reduce services.

The five per cent increase takes the form of \$259,000, part of a 1983 budget of \$6,411,430.

Spending for social assistance in 1983, is 48 per cent higher than in the previous year, 1982. Spending on roads accounts for 43 per cent of the new budget, and social and family services, 32 per cent. Eleven per cent of the budget is devoted to health.
