Garbage collector granted the increase

The item was, "Council agreed to pay five per cent more for garbage service in 1983, and six per cent more in 1984, until the end of the year, or the end of Eric Pauze's contract, whichever comes first."

A committee is conducting a search for a new dump for the use of Midland, Penetanguishene, Tiny Township, and Tay Township, and is also investigating other means of disposing of garbage. If a new dump is chosen soon, the dump operated by Pauze could be closed before 1985.
