We had a very strong showing in Level 7. Adele Lisi placed 3rd on floor and 6th in vault and uneven bars. She finished 7th overall.

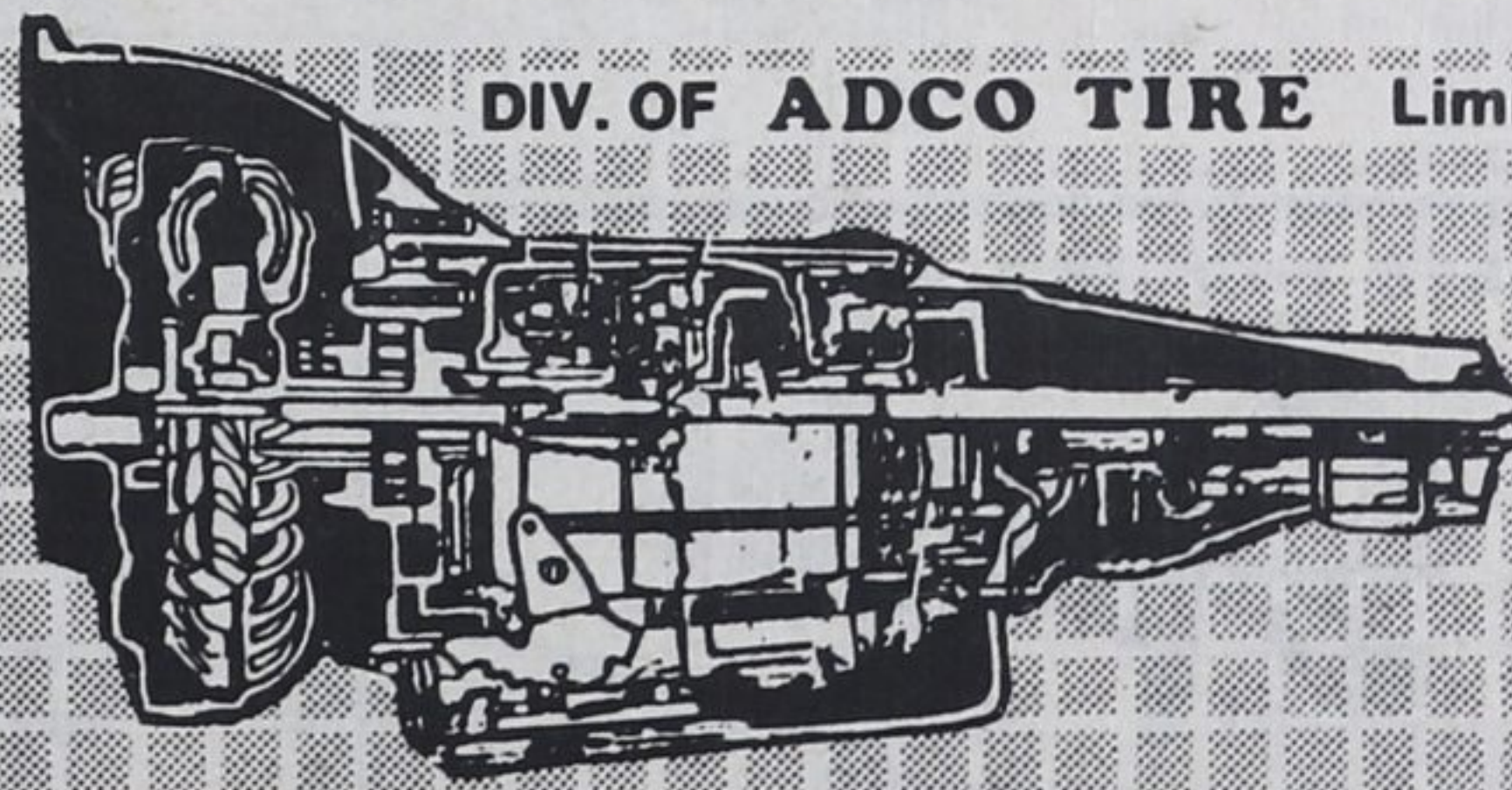
