Elmvale council briefs

At a regular meeting of Elmvale village council on Monday, April 11, Council authorized the purchase of 30 trees from the Elmvale and District Horticultural Society for planting in various locations around the village. The trees will

replace many older trees which had to be cut down to make space for the widening of streets or died of old age. Clerk Faye Townes said that the trees chosen were hard maples, which are slow-growing sturdy trees with a long

life span. The trees cost \$30 each.

The Clerk was instructed to secure prices for the installation of sidewalks in the village. When Council takes its annual spring tour, it will decide where sidewalks should be placed. Usually the spring tour takes place in the first week of May, depending on the weather.

Council approved accounts in the following amounts: Finance \$2,198.65, Public Works \$2,365.91, Building dept. \$10.00, Water \$136.29, Hydro \$41,175.50, Total \$45,886.35.

The next meeting of Council will be held on April 25 at 7:45 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

Debenture to fund room

Medonte East School will soon have its new general purpose room, if all goes well at the county level and the Ontario Municipal Board.

Trustee Joan Jensen; now this funding is no longer available, and the money must come from the budget.

The amount will not appear on the 1983 Budget, because it will be debentured over five years.

At the SCBE budget meeting on April 13, the administration was authorized to ask for Simcoe County's approval for the issue of a \$300,000 debenture on the board's behalf. If the County and the O.M.B. approves the Administration will then call for tenders for the general purpose room. A majority of trustees at the meeting agreed that the general purpose room was a high priority, worth while as an advantage to the school and as a focal point of the community. In previous years, funding for such projects was available from the sale of properties, according to
