Runway extension years in future, Sullivan says

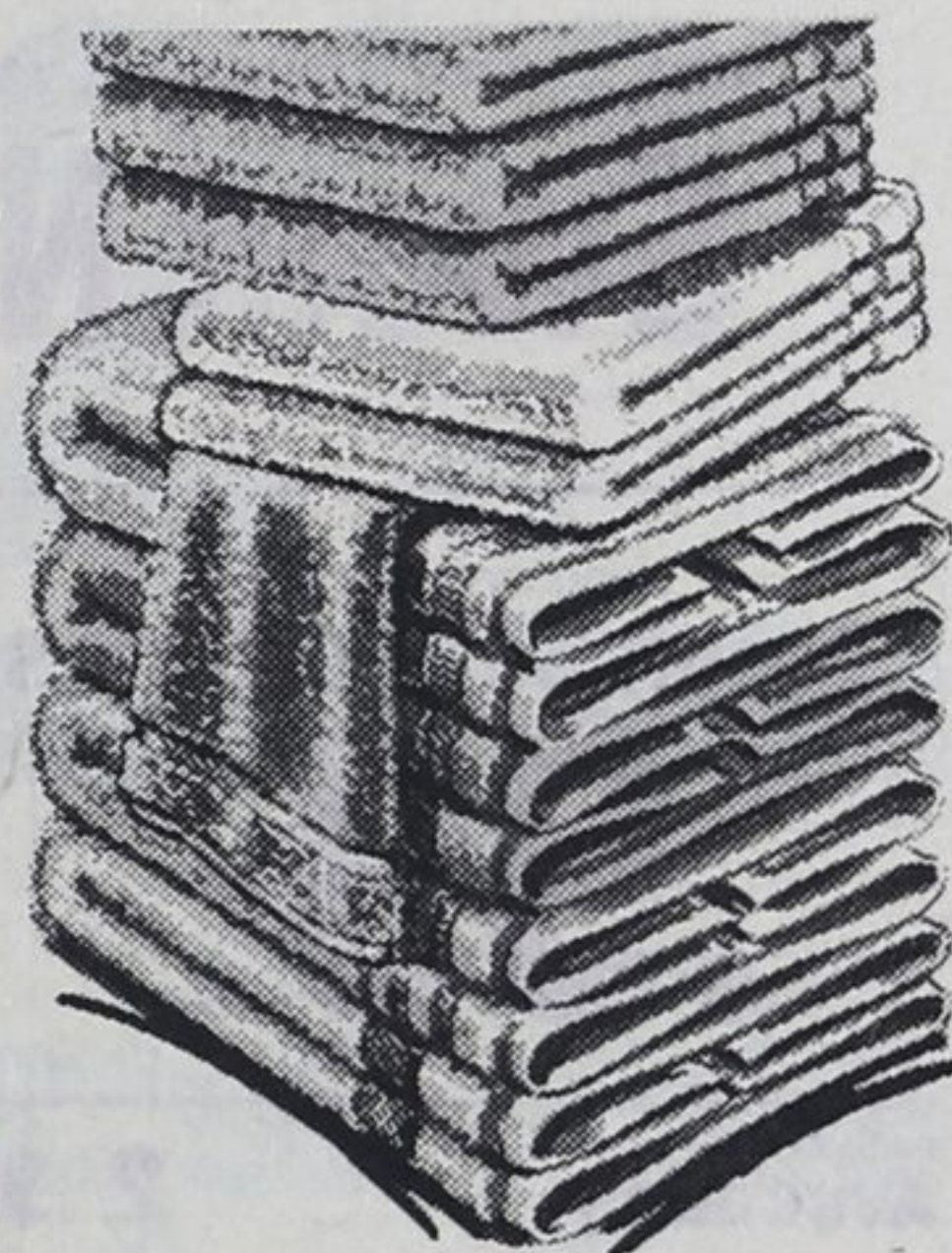
Extension of the runway of Huronia Airport is at least three years away, airport commission chairman Robert Sullivan said yesterday. The cost of adding 500 feet to the 3,000 foot runway would be \$180,000, he said. Eighty per cent of the cost would be paid by the province. The remainder would be paid out of the commission's capital expansion fund, which stands at over \$20,000 at present, he said.

The airport makes money through activities such as selling gasoline and renting space for airplanes. It also receives an annual budget from Midland, Penetanguishene, and Tiny Township, \$36,000 in each of the last two years, and a subsidy from the province, currently \$12,500.

A master plan study being done on the airport will be delivered to the commission next month, Sullivan said. The interim master plan report says the runway need never be longer than 3,999 feet, Sullivan said.
