Summer small game tag no longer required

If you're hunting for small game in southern Ontario this summer, you won't need a resident's summer small game tag.

"I am pleased to inform resident hunters that the validity date on their licence to hunt small game has been extended to cover the period between April 1

and August 31," Natural Resources Minister Alan Pope said. "This is applicable to the Southern Region of the province only."

Hunters planning to hunt only during the summer will still require a small game licence but will not have to purchase an additional summer tag as in the past.


