Summer gym camp

Penetang-Midland Hurons Gymnastics club is sponsoring a summer gymnastics camp. There are two four-week camps, the first from June 27 to July 22, and the second from July 25 to August 19.

Each four-week camp is divided into two sessions. Morning sessions (8:30 a.m. to 12 noon) will be for advanced gymnasts, while the afternoon sessions (1 p.m. to 4 p.m.) will be for beginners. Each session will go five days a week.

Girls' events include balance beam, floor, uneven bars, vaulting, with some dance instruction. Boys' events include vaulting, floor, parallel bars, and rings.

Entrants must be six years of age and older.
