Mr. Mills came to the site and on looking over the situation agreed that he could not see the need to move the line. He said that he could give the order for the hook-up to be made but thought that he would like to talk to Mr. Leblanc first. The same afternoon word was received that the line and meter had to be moved.

The purpose of this letter is to let people know of our problems in dealing with Ontario Hydro and in particular Mr. Leblanc and to hopefully help someone else avoid this unnecessary hassle to people trying their best to make ends meet in these difficult economic times.

Everyone, including Mr. Leblanc, seemed to agree that it really didn't make any sense to move it but Mr. Leblanc said that didn't matter, it had to be moved. As usual, common sense did not prevail and as usual the average guy is the one who pays.

We are left wondering—do the Barrie and Penetang offices go by a different set of rules or do they just not communicate? Either way, why is it that we suffer for it?
