

Board supports crossing guard hiring

Last week, two days after Midland council stuck by its policy of not hiring adult crossing guards, the Simcoe County Board of Education approved in principle a motion that adult crossing guards be hired to guide school children crossing King Street, (Huron Park), Yonge Street (at Sixth Street), and Hugel Avenue (at Sixth Street).

However the board does not employ adult crossing guards. It leaves the choice to the county's municipalities.

Board trustee Joan Jensen has approached a number of service clubs and arranged for meetings with the head

of the local school principals' committee. Support from the clubs,

in the form of a reward or incentive for student crossing guards to be
