Panzica well-qualified to speak

Norman Panzica, scheduled to give a drug abuse seminar in Elmvale schools on Tuesday, May 24, is highly qualified for the task.

Panzica, a native of Welland, Ontario, is Senior Consultant to the Council on Drug Abuse, a consultant to the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police and a consultant to the Surgeon-General, Department of National Defence.

His involvement with drug abuse dates to 1960, when he was an investigative researcher with CBC-TV. Assigned to find a drug addict for interviewing, he made contact with a theology student and a police officer who were helping a heroin-addicted prostitute to rehabilitate herself. When an appropriate residence for her could not be found, she went to live with the Panzica family. About 50 other clients of both sexes were helped in this manner, and he has counselled about 400

other families and individuals. His counselling is not limited to drug cases.

In 1975, he testified by invitation to the Canadian Senate

committee studying cannabis laws and has presented to the LeDain Commission. He is a graduate of McMaster University in Hamilton, with further studies at York University in Toronto.

Publications include Chitty's Law Journal, Criminal Law Quarterly, the Journal of Drug Education as well as popular press and magazines. As well, he is the author of "Your Teen and Drugs: A Parents' Handbook," published in 1983 by McGraw-Hill Ryerson.

He has led discussions before an estimated 500,000 people in six provinces, ranging from Grade 4 students to such professionals as police officers, social workers, probation officers, teachers and military personnel. He has appeared in about 900 schools. As a counsellor, he is often called to testify in the matter of

sentencing.

In addition, he serves as a member of the (Ontario) Minister's Advisory Council on

Treatment of the Offender.

Mr. and Mrs. Panzica have four children and live in Toronto.
