A Canadian citizen is a person who has Canadian citizenship or nationality, whether by birth or as a result of a process of naturalization. A citizen of Canada has the following rights:

—full political participation—only a Canadian citizen may vote and run for political office in federal and some provincial elections;

—foreign travel and freedom of return—the privilege of travelling outside Canada on a Canadian passport and the right to re-enter Canada;

—full economic rights—some public service, business and professional positions and some commercial enterprises may be held only by Canadians.

As a new Canadian, all the rights of a citizen are yours. You can feel that this is your country, and that Canada's concerns are your concerns. When you become a Canadian citizen you owe loyalty to Canada as the country which you have chosen. You declare this loyalty when you take the Oath of Citizenship. Of course, you may still keep ties of affection and association with your former homeland.

Canadian law permits dual citizenship. When you become a Canadian citizen, the laws of your former country of citizenship may allow you to continue to hold your previous citizenship. You should seek information on this from a Consulate or Embassy of your former homeland.

It is very important to decide whether you wish to have more than one citizenship. In some cases, you may be subject to difficulties after becoming a Canadian citizen if you do not renounce your previous citizenship. For example, on a visit to your former homeland, you may still be treated as a citizen by that country and subject to all of its laws for its own citizens, including military service. Should you encounter difficulties there, the Canadian authorities may assist you only to the extent that the authorities of the foreign country permit, or may not be able to help you at all, especially if you have returned to reside in that country.
