Tay opens, accepts

Tay Township council, at its regular meeting of May 12, accepted a number of tenders for supplying goods and services to the township.

The tender by Ken Truax Construction to supply 27,000 tons of two inch and 58 inch gravel at \$3.80 per ton for a total tender amount of \$102,600 was accepted.

McKean Quarries will supply the Township with R.C. 30 Oil Prime limestone screenings at a total tender amount of \$54,805, after council accepted their tender.

Tay council also accepted the tender of Alan G. Cook Limited to supply 2,800 tons of 5% inch crusher run limestone at \$3.15 per ton, for a total tender amount of \$8,820, in view of the fact that this is the lowest of the two tenders when distance and mileage is considered.

Council approved and accepted the tender by Pollard Brothers for supplying liquid calcium at \$195.05 per unit for a total tender amount of \$23,796.10.

Finally, the tender by Allied Chemical for supplying flake calcium at \$215.82 MT for a total tender amount of \$5,827.14 was accepted.


