MOE survey

A new, 13.7 metre (45ft) survey vessel joins Environment Ontario's survey boats in a \$3 million water quality monitoring and investigation program on the Great Lakes, Environment Minister

Keith C. Norton has announced.

The vessel was christened "James Auld" in Orillia by Mrs. Nancy Auld to honor her late husband, Ontario's first Environment Minister.

James A.C. Auld was Minister of the Environment from 1972 to 1974, when the Ministry spearheaded the installation of phosphorus removal facilities at sewage treatment plants to protect Great Lakes waters from phosphorus pollution.

As Environment Minister, Auld also contributed to Ontario's continuing program to reduce and eliminate hazardous discharges and focused the attention on the then existing minimal control of effluents from pulp and paper mills.

The official ceremony was attended by Environment Minister Keith C. Norton as host; the Mayor of Orillia, Patricia McIsaac; and Director, Water Resources Branch, D.N. Jeffs; R.C. Johnston, Naval Architect; and E. Stoop and Cornelius Niter, President and Vice-President of Orillia Steel Works; Allan McLean, MPP for Simcoe East served as master of ceremonies.

"The new vessel will be an important tool in our Great Lakes surveillance program in fulfillment of Ontario's commitment to the Canada-Ontario Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement signed July, 12, 1982", Norton said.

"It will also contribute information to the International Joint Commission to evaluate the progress made by Canada and the United States in meeting objectives contained in the Canada-U.S. Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement."

In the Lake Erie basin, studies will concentrate on contaminants in sediments and aquatic organisms in Lake St. Clair and in the St. Clair and Detroit Rivers draining into Lake Erie.

On Lake Huron, effects of St. Marys River flow changes and water quality in the Penetang-Midland-Sturgeon Bay areas will be investigated.

For Canadians, boating is a good investment. There are no licence fees to pay, and there is plenty of access to boating waters. With the best natural facilities in the world, more people are enjoying boating in their leisure hours than ever before.

To help you enjoy your boating even more use the following fuel-saving tips and get more boating fun for your dollar.

1. **THROTTLE BACK** - by reducing your outboard throttle setting from 5500 r.p.m. to 4700 r.p.m., you can save 45 percent of your fuel while losing only 20 percent of our boat speed. By reducing your stern drive r.p.m. from 4200 to 3200, you reduce consumption by 60 percent while losing just 22 percent of our boat speed.

2. **USE THE RIGHT PROP** - You get more efficiency (more push per ounce of fuel) if your prop is right for the engine and boat size. Invest in a tachometer and save fuel. Never run with a prop that is bent or nicked.

3. **TUNE UP FREQUENTLY** - Start the season with a well-tuned engine. Fouled plugs, poor timing, and clogged ports reduce the efficiency of your engine and you use more gas per mile. Have a mid-season tune-up this year as well to ensure the maximum performance from your motor. You save fuel and money.

4. **CLEAN THE HULL** - Your boat moves through the water better when the hull bottom is clear of fouling such as algae and weeds. If you keep your boat in the water during the season, clean it frequently, either under water or by hauling a couple of times to scrub her clean. Make sure that the lower unit of the motor is clean, as fouling of the prop will seriously cut its effectiveness.

5. **USE THE PROPER MIX** - Measure and mix your fuel accurately, using oil recommended by the manufacturer, at the proper ratio.

6. **DON'T IDLE UNNECESSARILY** - Most motors are engineered to warm up quickly.

7. **FUEL YOUR BOAT CAREFULLY** - There is no need to waste fuel through careless filling of your outboard or portable tanks.

8. **BETTER YET** - Put sails on your boat.
